ELECTRICAL STORMS ON THE PRAIRIES DELAYS HARVESTING OPERATIONS

Liberal Progressive is Elected in Provencher

Higher Powers are on Side of Mackenzie King at Opening of Big Election Contest Which Commenced Yesterday

OTTAWA, Sept. 1 .- The election of A. L. Beaubien as a Liberal-Conservative member in Provencher, Manitoba, featured he nominations yesterday in the 27 constituencies in which, owing to the large area and scattered population, the nominaons were held one week earlier, additional time being required to make voting arrangements.

The election of Beaubien was due to the inability of the Conservative opponent, Dr. R. H. McFadden, to file the candidate papers before nominations closed as a result of the muddy roads.

Once in a while a little water came over the side while we were going across. Then suddenly she sank, Kenny said, and he at once started to swim ashore.
