RUBBER KING TELLS ABOUT PRICE RAISE

Says Americans Have Only Themselves to Blame for Forcing Prices Down

SUPPLY REGULATED

Were Caught When Sudden Demand Made Price Jump to 80c.

SYDNEY, Australia, March 2 (By C. P. Correspondent)—

The fact that rubber is on the bounce—in so far as its price is concerned—has given rise to many complaints and threats from United States manufacturing concerns who use the commodity in its raw form.

Added interest is given, therefore, to an interview with Alna Baker, the "Rubber King," from the Federated Malay States, who was in Sydney last week on his way to New Zealand.

Mr. Baker said that Americans had only themselves to blame for forcing the rubber market down, prior to the early part of last year, and in the second place, when the market began to rise, for not taking advantage of the offer of the British rubber interests to standardise the price of rubber at 50 cents a pound for ten years. Now, from 25 cents in May, 1924, rubber is 80 cents a pound and the United States of America, as the chief buyer, is paying through the nose. In buying rubber, 75 per cent of which is British controlled, and upon the supply of which industries with an investment of \$20,000,000,000 in America depend, the United States in 1924 had to pay \$170,000,000. In 1925 she had to pay about \$225,000,000.

Market Manipulation

It was all hush for the U.S.A. House of Representatives to talk about investigating the alleged manipulation of the price of crude rubber by the British and Colonial Government, said Mr. Baker, because the boom in rubber had followed directly upon America's own manipulation of the market.

Under a scheme initiated by Lord Stevenson in November, 1922, Mr. Baker explained, the supply of rubber to the United States of America had been regulated according to the price. Taking a certain standard of production, the amount was increased or decreased by 10 per cent every three months according to whether the price rose

Corner in Wheat

"It is no use their protesting," Mr. Baker said. "They have brought it on themselves. When they protested to the British Colonial office, they were reminded that America last year had not scrupled to 'corner' the wheat market and raise the price, and wheat was a necessity of life.

"It was the United States in the first place which forced the price of rubber down by buying from hand to mouth, leading to restrictions in the supply. Then, when there had come a sudden demand for rubber last year, they found that they had been caught.

"When the price began to go up, we offered them the output for ten years at 50 cents a pound," added Mr. Baker, "but they would not take it.

"We ourselves don't want rubber to be so high. It has a general unsettling effect, particularly on labor. As a matter of fact 20 cents a pound pays for all expenses of producing rubber. The rest is all profit."

Seventeen Million Cars

"The increase in cheap cars and the demand for balloon tyres," Mr. Baker said, "had been causes of the rubber boom. At present there were 17,750,000 cars in the United States, or one for every six of the population, and the States were taking rubber at the rate of 375,000 tons a year. Compared with before the war, she was buying seven times more rubber at four times the price.

called the 'British rubber monopoly.'

"According to United States opinion, it was felt that the only permanent relief would be the investment of American capital in rubber-growing projects.

"Investigations are reported to have shown that in the Philippines the soil and climate conditions are suitable for large rubber-growing projects, though the absence of cheap coolie labor is a drawback."

Pivot of Trade

In conclusion, Mr. Baker said: "It has not yet been realised what the rubber planters of Malaya have done for the Empire. Rubber is the pivot of trade between England and the United States and the value of rubber exported to the United States has been the one factor which has enabled the exchange to come back to parity.

"Rubber alone has enabled England to pay considerably more than the interest on her war loans and has helped her to a great extent to pay off some of her war debts."

During the war Mr. Baker started the Battleplane Campaign by means of which he obtained for the Empire 94 planes. Of these 41 were provided by his efforts in Australia and 53 by his campaign in Malaya.
