# HANSON CASE BEING TRIED

(continued from page one)

Evidence would be produced by the defence to explain everything except the loss of the money.

## HANSON ON STAND

The accused, taking the stand in his own defence, explained that he was a fisherman by occupation and had been with the Cold Storage as its fish buyer for three seasons, previously having been employed by the company in other capacities. He told in some detail of this season's work leading up to the date of the alleged robbery. His movements on that day he also described minutely. He had brought the money from his house he said on the morning of July 23 and it was when he was passing through the boiler house going toward the boat that he had the bundle of \$4,000 under his shirt. It was also then that the fireman had shouted, "What have you got on your hip?" It was a lie that this question had been asked later in the morning when he was passing through the boiler house on his way from the boiler house to the street.

Hanson's evidence, with regard to conversations, was to a large extent corroborative of that of crown witnesses.

## FEARED FOR MONEY

He told of the night previous to the robbery when his wife was bathing the babies and the dog had barked. His wife was afraid when he kept so much money in the house and asked that he discontinue such practice.

On the afternoon of July 23 when he entered his stateroom on the boat with a view to getting the money and taking it to the office, the stateroom door, which he had thought was locked, was open, the hasp had been torn off and the drawer open. The cashbox containing the money was gone. Then the robbery was reported to the company.

the afternoon when accused called him from the engine room and, pointing to the padlock hasp which had been broken off the drawer in his (the captain's) cabin, informed him that \$4,000 was missing. They then went in search of Mr. Johnson or Mr. Nicholls, and then to Mr. Blance and, finally to Mr. Darton, to report the loss. Details of various dealings between witness and accused were described and particular reference was made to the manner in which the hasp had been removed, witness declaring it had been pried off as it would have been impossible to unscrew it with the drawer locked.

Under cross examination witness declared that he had seen nothing to direct suspicion against accused and admitted the possibility of others knowing where the money was kept and coming aboard and taking it.

J. W. Nicholls, controller of the Canadian Fish & Cold Storage Co., was on the stand for over an hour. His evidence hinged particularly on conversations that he had had with accused before and after his arrest, namely, on the day when Capt. Hanson reported the loss and, again, an explanation made by Hanson after he had been placed under arrest in which accused stated his suspicion that it was Moorehouse who had taken the money.

In the latter conversation, accused had given reasons for his suspicion, one of them being Moorehouse, who was in charge of the boat's store, had obtained old salmon spoons and, after shining them up, had sold them to fishermen at the price charged for the new articles in city stores.

## BUYING LIQUOR

Among other things, Hanson had stated that he had used money given him to buy fish to buy liquor to take out to the fishermen. Such practice, Mr. Nicholls declared, was contrary to the company rules. The money given the fish buyers was to be used for buying fish and for no other purpose whatever.

In the course of Mr. Nicholls' examination, intricacies in connection with money given Hanson and fish bought by him came up. It appeared that it was the custom to give a lump sum at the first of the season, in this case \$4,000, and, on a load being delivered, remitting to the packer the amount he had expended in buying it, thus always keeping his supply of money up to the original sum, a final accounting being made at the end of the season. Return checks in favor of Hanson, log books taken from the Zibassa after the robbery, etc., were placed in evidence and many financial transactions in which accused had been involved were recounted. Most of the information had been obtained by Mr. Nicholls in conversations with Capt. Hanson.

## IMPORTANT WITNESS

The most important crown witness and the only one who was able to give anything bordering on the region of direct evidence was R. Berney, a fireman at the Cold Storage, who testified that Hanson had passed through the boiler room from wharf to street on the morning in question. He thought he saw Hanson carrying something under his coat and he shouted "What have you got on your hip?" Hanson did not say anything but put out his hand and shook his head. Next morning when he had heard of the robbery, witness said, his mind went back to the seeing of the bulge in Hanson's coat.

Confronted in cross-examination by Mr. Patmore with evidence of the preliminary trial when he had said posi-

tively that Hanson's hands were not in his pockets, witness said that he could not now remember whether they were or not. At the suggestion of the judge witness tried to walk holding a parcel corresponding in size to that which he said Hanson carried in his coat with his arms free. This it was found possible to do.

After Berney had been heard, court adjourned until this morning.
