handlings this season. Of the total, 721,500 pounds was from American vessels and 321,050 pounds from Canadian. The total for the year to date is 5,760,050 pounds. 4,367,600 pounds from American boats and 1,392,450 pounds from Canadian. Prices for the week varied from 12c to 16c for American first class fish and from 11c to 14c for Canadian. Second class prices ranged from 6c to 8c.

A 40-foot seine boat is being built at Cow Bay by Y. Suyehiro for H. Brown of Kitkalla. The vessel will be powered with a 20 h.p. Atlas engine.

The Canadian Fish & Gold Storage Co.'s packer Chief Zibassa, Capt. Bert Hanson, will sail on Tuesday next for the Queen Charlotte Islands on a fish buying trip—her first of the season. She will first go to Skidegate and later will proceed to the Hippo Island trolling grounds. Capt. Hanson and Chief Engineer Moorehouse have been putting in a busy time lately on the vessel getting her in ship shape, the work including some important mechanical changes. It is understood that a big welcome awaits the popular Bert at the Islands where he has a host of friends, a dance being on taps at Skidegate.
