# JAIL FOR LIFE MANSLAUGHTER EDMONTON CASE

Archie Killips and Nick Hawryluk, 17 Years of Age, Plead Guilty to Killing

EDMONTON, April 13.—Archie Killips and Nick Hawryluk, 17 year old youths, who pleaded guilty yesterday to a charge of manslaughter in connection with the death of Jacob Miller, an aged storekeeper, on January 4, were sentenced to life imprisonment this morning by Mr. Justice Walsh.

During the trial affidavits were introduced in which it was alleged that John F. Anderson, police informer, had instigated the crime and had even taken the boy down to the store.

Mr. Justice Walsh stated that investigation had led him to believe there was no ground for the charge.

### Boys Confessed

The confession of the lads as told by detectives at the trial showed that after supper on the night of January 4 Killips had put both rifles in the back of the borrowed auto and picked up Hawryluk near his home. Killips gave Hawryluk half a box of

# WHALERS ARE OVERHAULING

Will Leave Victoria For Queen Charlotte Islands on May 10 This Year

VICTORIA, April 12.—In preparation for their coming season the six whalers of the Consolidated Corporation will be overhauled by the Victoria Machinery Dept. Two small vessels, Grant and White, were hauled out on the V.M.D. slip to be surveyed before the repairs commence.

In view of the fact that a mild winter has been experienced on this coast the whalers will commence their season's work earlier this year. They will leave for the Rose and Naden Harbor stations on May 10.

The whaling corporations will only operate two stations this year, as they disposed of their third plant at Kyuquot to a fishing corporation to be used for fish reduction purposes, along with the two whalers, Orion and St. Lawrence.

Last year Rose Harbor led in the greatest number of catches over the other two stations and the skippers and crew of the whalers are looking forward to a busy season.

The whaling tender Gray has already made one trip to the stations with supplies, and she left again on Good Friday with a cargo of lumber to be used in repairing the stations.

# FLOATING HOSPITAL FOR THE YUKON RIVER

Will Cater to Needs of Natives and White People Resident in that Part of Alaska

SEATTLE, April 13.—Governor George A. Parks of Alaska, announces here that a floating hospital to carry a physician and two nurses will be put in service this year along 4,000 navigable miles of the Yukon river in the interior of Alaska and serve 5,000 isolated natives and whites.

"Throughout the district drained by the Yukon and its tributaries Parks said, 'we have only two doctors and three nurses.

"When news of an epidemic of any kind reaches us it takes days and sometimes weeks to get medical assistance to the stricken area. Most of the natives live along the river so that a hospital boat will be able to reach practically all of them.

"Not long ago a number of natives, 400 to 500 miles from Fort Yukon, died from eating spoiled caribou meat. Our traveling hospital will prevent such disasters."

# ASSAULT CASE COURT TODAY

Local Young Men Remanded Until Tomorrow With Bail Raised

In a session of the city police court before Magistrate McClymont which was in progress from 10 o'clock this morning until 1 o'clock this afternoon, evidence for the crown was presented in the case of Murdoch Mackenzie, Lawrence Capstick and Darrow Casey, who are charged with attempted rape on complaint of Florence Morrison, an 18 year old girl. The case was then adjourned until 10 o'clock tomorrow morning and bail was set at \$1,000 each. The charge is an indictable one with City Solicitor E. F. Jones appearing for the crown and Milton Gonzales for the defence.

The story of the incident in McClymont Park about 9:30 last Tuesday night was unfolded to the court by the girl who was nervous and inclined to break down. She went to the park with other friends and the assault is alleged to have occurred after they departed. The girl associated Mackenzie and Capstick directly with the assault but was not sure about Casey's participation.

Other witnesses for the crown were Dr. H. E. Tremayne, Dave Hudema, Tom Howe, George Shenton and Sgt. McElinchy. The case was heard in camera.

# EDMONTON TAXES INDICATE GREATLY IMPROVED CONDITION

EDMONTON, April 13.—An increase of nearly 50 per cent in the city tax collections for the first three months of the year, compared with the first quarter of 1925, is reported by Commissioner D. Mitchell. The total receipts amounted to \$222,043 or an increase of \$72,611 on last year's comparative figures for the same period.

The payments of arrears totalled \$159,822 as against \$136,221 a year ago while land sales produced \$42,762 or nearly \$30,000 more than by the end of March, 1925. The current taxes for the quarter also made a material gain, totalling \$19,458 compared with \$382 last year. The total payments for March aggregated

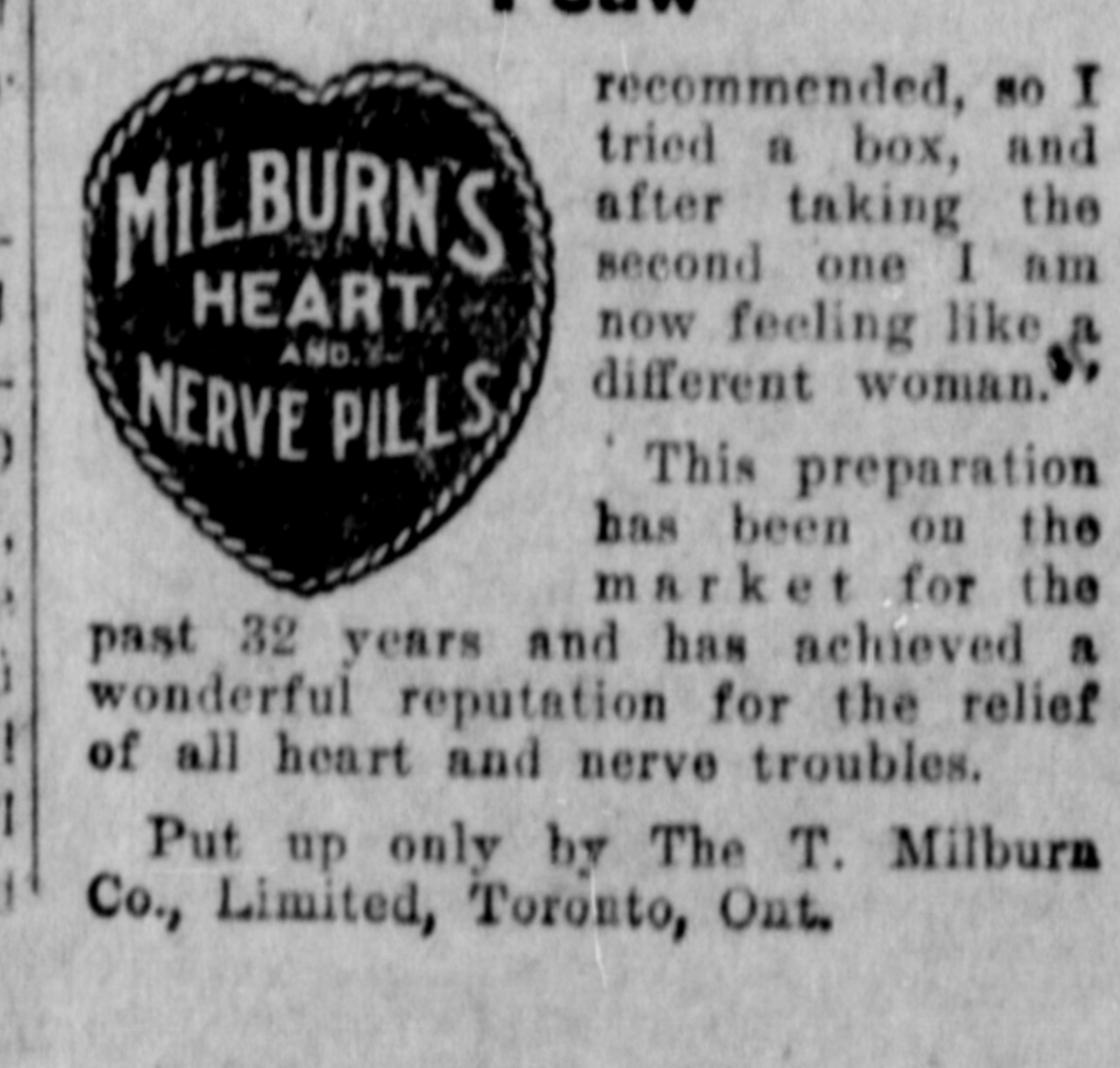
