## ORE PICKED UP DUTHIE MINE

### Even Better Results Since Fault Was Encountered Rouses Enthusiasm

A body of ore equaling in extent and richness the best that has yet been opened was encountered in work carried on at the Duthie mine last week to increase the prospects for larger shipments and additions to the working force during coming months says the Interior News, published at Smithers. Two months ago there was considerable depression around the mine through encountering a bad fault, and work has been conducted for several weeks in an effort to again pick up the lead. Strong and general was the enthusiasm in town as well as at the mine when the extended tunnels again picked up the ore in even greater strength than preceding the fracture.

Under the adverse hauling conditions ore has been coming down steadily from the mine and the thirty-fourth carload is being shipped this week from Smithers. The roads just now are in fair shape and good progress is being made, but the past few months have presented much of grief and difficulty to the management, a condition that will be even more acute when the spring break-up sets in.

## WHITE RACCOON ON GALIANO ISLAND IS UNIQUE FUR BEARER

### Supposed to be the Only One in British Columbia if Not in Dominion

GALIANO, Feb. 17.—Among all the fur-bearing animals upon Galiano Island's far farm owned by W. Miller Higgs perhaps there is none of greater interest than the pure white raccoon recently imported from Ontario. This little female raccoon was found with two other ordinary raccoons by Leslie Gibson, of Denfield, Ontario, in the woods near his home. He advertised it and Mr. Higgs immediately wired. In an interview Mr. Higgs said: "I consider that I was most fortunate in securing this unique raccoon, for Dr. Gill—the well-known breeder of the strain of black raccoons in Nova Scotia—likewise wired for this animal, but his wire was received just after mine. Dr. Gill has since written to know if I would sell, but my answer has been in the negative."

The animal was naturally very wild upon its arrival but has happily settled down in its new quarters and seems greatly attached to its mate. The pens for raccoons are ideally situated in open woodland. Each pen is about twelve feet by ten feet, and ten feet high, wired over the top. For the most part the animals are very tame and will readily eat out of the hand. Raccoons are most interesting fur-bearing animals to raise. They are very particular in their habits,
