BRUCE SPEAKS ON DOMINIONS

BELIEVES EACH PART OF EMPIRE SHOULD DO ITS PART IN RELATION TO DEFENCE

LONDON, Nov. 3.—Premier Bruce of Australia in an interview with the press here said:

"In the last fifteen years we have been developing a new conception of Dominion status and have recognized now for a long time that inside the Empire there is the principle established of absolute independence on all domestic questions, with the right of consultation on all matters of common concern. If there still remains anything in which any of the self-governing parts of the Empire have not absolute freedom and independence in domestic affairs, it is right that we should consider what legal and practical steps to take to give that independence. As to consultation on matters of common concern, I don't anticipate the slightest difficulty in fixing up anything that needs to be done to improve the machinery.

FOREIGN RELATIONS

"As to the broader question of our relations with foreign countries I do not think that it is desirable that this question should be raised as an issue, but I see no objection to our discussing and defining the position which we have reached in the process of evolution. I am totally opposed to the idea that there has to be some drastic alteration in the position of the Empire to foreign countries. I am opposed to any idea of laying down a written Constitution for the Empire. If there had been such a thing in the last fifteen years the war would have smashed it to pieces, or it would have smashed the Empire.

"The next point is defence. I say we stand for a policy of Empire defence in which each part of the Empire bears the share which it is capable of bearing according to its man-power, resources and wealth.

INTER-IMPERIAL TRADE

"As to inter-imperial trade, I can only say what I have said before, that I think the solution of the big problems of Empire is through co-operation within the Empire. This idea that I

It is the final shipment of the season, as beginning November 1, operations at the mine were suspended for the winter.

In connection with the closing down of the mine at the present time, Miles Donald, the manager, states that there were several factors governing the decision to close at this time. He states that there are at present 150 tons of ore blocked out ready to stope. But with the present price of silver and with the uncertainty of the market together with the present heavy overhead expenses in mining it was thought best to suspend operations for the season. The future policy of the company will call for new operating conditions and plans as well as a possible readjustment. The management has in view new development operations and the installing of machinery and a mill, so that the property may be more economically and profitably worked. It is proposed to drive a new working tunnel. This tunnel will be 340 feet in length and will tap the present ore body at a further depth of 150 feet which will give more than three hundred feet of stoping ore.

While the plans for the mill have not been worked out in detail, it is proposed to install one that will take care of the tonnage, and thus do away with the present heavy transportation costs, and also the additional excess cost of sorting and sacking. With a mill the present low grade ore, that is not found profitable to ship, can be handled. It is planned to start operations as early in 1927 as the season will permit.

MIGRATION

The wall is six hundred feet in length with a width of eight feet at the top. It is expected that the wall will be extended another three hundred feet next year.

The herd of caribou that has roamed the country between the Naas Valley and Alice Arm and beyond is disappearing in the opinion of John Strombeck, Frank Stringham and R. Moore who recently spent several days hunting them. No trace could be found of them in their favorite haunts and it is thought that they have either left the district or fallen a prey to the hunters' guns or the bands of wolves.

R. J. C. Moore, after spending a week in Alice Arm and vicinity in search of caribou, has left for Prince Rupert, whence he will proceed to Porcher Island for some deer shooting.
