## DOCK TO OPEN THIS SUMMER

July or August Next Set as Time For Ceremonies at Esquimalt

ESQUIMALT, April 6.—The giant drydock at Skinner's Cove, built at a cost of approximately \$6,000,000 by the Dominion government, will be formally opened about the end of July or the beginning of August. The actual date of the ceremony will be set by Hon. J. H. King, federal minister of public works. It is expected that the dock will be opened by Mr. King.

This new drydock will, from present indications, prove the nucleus around which many marine industries will cluster. With the launching of the second caisson set for April 12 practically all the work has been completed. All that remains now is the installation of the travelling crane and a few other minor details. The second drydock gate which will be launched by Yarrows next month was built at a cost of \$225,000. When launched it will weigh 700 tons, its final weight being 1,600 tons. In length it is 140 feet, with a beam of twenty-seven feet and forty-nine feet deep. When submerged it will draw approximately forty-five feet of water.

hewn out of the living rock, measures 1,150 feet long, 149 feet in width at the top, 126 feet at the bottom; its depth is forty-nine feet six inches, with forty feet of water on sills at high water.

The dock will take any ship afloat, or, if desired, can be divided into two sections of 400 feet and 750 feet respectively. It is lined with concrete, with granite coping allars or steps, granite keel and bilge block seats, and is equipped with four caisson berths of granite.

**Immensely ork**

The building of the massive dock was commenced in 1921 and has taken four years to complete. To make ready for this dock it was necessary to excavate 81,000 cubic yards of dredging, 41,000 cubic yards of earth excavation and 350,000 cubic yards of rock excavation, while in the construction of the dock there was used 103,000 cubic yards of concrete, 105,000 cubic feet of granite, 36,000 pounds of wrought iron, 141,000 pounds of steel, 50,000 lineal feet of piping of various kinds, 1,800 tons of cast-iron, and approximately 2,500 tons of steel were used in the construction of the caissons.

**Only One Larger**

There is only one larger dock in the world, and that is the Commonwealth, at Boston, Mass., which is twenty-nine feet longer. Victoria's new dock will be the largest in the British Empire.

The dock will be operated electrically. There are three fifty-four-inch main pumps and two twenty-two inch auxiliary pumps, which empty the dock in four hours. The water is pumped out into the sea through a

600-foot tunnel measuring nine by fourteen feet.

When filled the dock contains 42,000,000 gallons of water.

## THOROUGHbred BREEDING STOCK FOR PRAIRIES

Largest Shipment of Thoroughbred Horses Ever Brought from England Now in Winnipeg

WINNipeg, April 5.—The largest shipment of thoroughbred horses ever to leave England for Canada is now in Winnipeg enroute to Calgary, having travelled more than 4,000 miles of the long journey from Avonmouth, Bristol. The shipment which originally included 27 horses, five Irish setter dogs and two Sealhams, crossed the Atlantic on the S.S. Parthenia and is making the rail journey in palace cars provided by the Canadian National Railways.

Capt. A. R. Lidington, who is taking the stock to Alberta for racing breeding purposes, first visited that province in January of last year, being strongly urged by Calgaryans interested in the thoroughbred horse industry to secure some English stock for them, he promised to do so but before going back to the old country he purchased four thousand acres of ranch land in the Highwood district, twenty miles from the Prince of Wales ranch.

Although he sold six of the lot he has just brought out while in Ottawa, Capt. Lidington hopes to retain a number of these horses to restock his ranch and intends to return to England shortly to bring out another shipment and will then take up his residence in the foothills. He is accompanied this time by his father, Major V. W. Lidington, of Thame, Oxfordshire, a well known breeder of race horses who is now making his first visit to Canada. Both men are enthusiastic about the west and Capt. Lidington is looking forward with pleasure to the time a few months hence when he will settle in Alberta for good and predicts a good future for the thoroughbred horse industry throughout the Dominion.

## LIVED 4 WEEKS ON FLUID DIET

People Fasted For Health on Large Scale in England

LONDON, April 7.—Fasting as a cure for disease is being tested on a scale never before attempted in Great Britain at a house near Tring, Hertfordshire, where Lady Fisher, the wife of Sir N. F. Warran Fisher, Permanent Secretary to the Treasury, has, with 40 other people, live for four weeks on fruit drinks and water in which vegetables have been boiled.

Abstinence from food seemed to have endowed them with fresh stores of energy. Men advanced in years ran up the house stairs (two or three steps at a time, and middle-aged women played croquet with something of the vim of a schoolgirls' hockey team.

It is the first rule of the house that fasting must not be carried to excess, but one woman patient consumed only fruit juices during 63 days, while another lived on water for 54 days before she wanted food.

Robert S. Provis, a Manchester manufacturer, who was carried into the home in Christmas week, said to be suffering from pernicious anaemia, was then, in his own words, "an emaciated ghost." Now he is full featured and rosy checked and almost as agile as a youth, having completed his cure this week with a 17-mile walk.

Another patient said he had had only one craving in 26 days.

On the eighth day he was seized with an overpowering desire for tobacco and smoked three cigars in succession. Since then he had not wanted to smoke.

Fasting is begun by a gradual diminution of food, but its ending demands caution. It finishes with a mixed diet of milk and water, increased until 12 pints of milk are drunk daily. The juices of ripe fruit are next given to the patient, and the treatment is completed with meals of shredded wheat, oranges, apples, bananas, nuts and dates, macaroni, vegetables and pudding.
