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BLACKWOOD on Bridge

Mr. Muzzy Flubbed One, But Wouldn't Admit It

"Well, I had a two-way finesse in hearts," alibied Mr. Muzzy after he went set at his three no trump contract. "It was purely a 50-50 guess and I just guessed wrong."

Actually, Mr. Muzzy had no excuse. He did not have a two-way finesse in the heart suit. As the cards lie, he could go only one way—if he wanted to have a chance for nine tricks.

Do you see why? Mr. Champion opened the queen of spades and Mr. Muzzy properly ducked. A spade was continued and won with the ace and returned the suit.

At this point Mr. Muzzy correctly figured that he didn't have time to try and set the clubs. To do so he would have to lose the lead twice—and the first time he lost it, the enemy would surely knock out his last spade stopper.

But he could make his contract without any club winners if he could bring in four hearts. He led to the ace of hearts, returned the 10 and let it ride. Mr. Champion won the queen and after that there was no chance of taking more than eight tricks.

The proper play of the heart suit represents a situation which is often missed. Mr. Muzzy should have led the deuce first and fished the ten. This is not because Mr. Champion had overcalled and is therefore more likely to hold the queen. Mr. Champion must hold the queen, not over three long, or the contract cannot be made.

There is only one exception to that statement and that is if Mr. Abel should hold the queen singleton—a very remote chance.

Let's look at it the other way around. Suppose Mr. Abel does hold the queen with one or two other hearts. If you play to the ace, as Mr. Muzzy did, and return the ten, the queen will cover and you must play your king. Thus you would be forced to play two of your heart honors on one trick and the nine in Mr. Champion's hand would stop the suit.

If Mr. Abel held the queen

and at least three other hearts, he would simply let the ten win. As dummy would have no more hearts to lead through, the guarded queen would stop the suit.
