NO OBLIGATION There will be no obligation on the government to act, no matter how many signatures are obtained. To comply with the rules of the Commons, the petition must be drafted in terse, legal language. It will "pray" the government to "consider" the need for a national health insurance program.

In his broadcast, Mr. Coldwell said the Liberal party has been 'promising" national health insurance since 1919. For 33 years there have been "procrastination and delays."

The petition, he said, will call for a program to provide all citizens, irrespective of income, full hospital, medical, dental and optical care.

He added:


