Take Care When Finessing
Against Opponents' Queen

Sometimes you have a suit in which you can finesse either way against the queen. Often, in these cases, the main problem is not to guess which opponent has the queen, but to make sure that the lead is not lost to the opponent who can make a damaging return.

Mr. Muzzy had such a situation in his heart suit in today's deal. Mrs. Keen opened the queen of spades and everybody played low, the queen winning. Mr. Dale mentally kicked himself for not putting up his king. Probably Mr. Muzzy still would have ducked and Mr. Dale could then have pushed his queen of diamonds through.

Mr. Muzzy made a good play by ducking, although it is not certain that he knew why he did it. As you see, he could afford to lose a spade, a heart and a diamond. He was certain to be able to hold his diamond losses to one if he kept the lead in Mrs. Keen's hand.

But, after winning the spade continuation, he started on hearts, cashing the ace and king and thereby setting up Mr. Dale's queen. Next he started clubs. But Mr. Dale ruffed the third round and his side quickly collected two diamond tricks to defeat the contract.

Mr. Champion's exasperation was justified. "Why not finesse against Dale for the queen of hearts?" he demanded. "You didn't care whether it won or lost because it would surely prevent a lead through your king of diamonds."

saw its leader—Georges Lapalme—defeated.

Regardless of how provinces voted, said Mr. St. Laurent, "we should arrange to have them represented as well as possible in the federal arena."

From that point, he went on to say that federal cabinet members "as ministers" should not attempt to influence a provincial election.

That did not mean, he said, that federal cabinet ministers should not participate in provincial election campaigns. As electors of a province, it was right that they should take an interest in provincial politics.

Mr. St. Laurent said that in the Quebec election last July he had voted as a resident of Quebec. He had made it clear how he planned to vote, but he also made it clear that no matter which party formed a government, it would be recognized as the choice of the Quebec people.

Woman Rail Expert Busy For 25 Years

TORONTO (CP)—Other people's travels have been Mrs. Alice Saunders' business for the last quarter of a century.

Mrs. Saunders, who retired recently as secretary to the superintendent of the Toronto Terminal Railway Company, has been a witness to many historical occasions in her 25 years of watching the world go by.

She recalls the 1939 visit of the King and Queen and the funeral cortege of Canada's former Prime Minister Mackenzie King. She has been on hand for the visits of Presidents of the United States and France and also for the tour a year ago of the then Princess Elizabeth and Prince Philip.

"Most of them were just names on paper," she said, "though we handled all the details such as deciding which doors were to be kept locked or left open and seeing that the switches in the yards were spiked so that no other trains got in the way."

"There has never been a dull moment," said Mrs. Saunders, who comes from Hampstead, N.B., "and I wouldn't change a minute of it."

She plans to live with relatives in Wichita, Kan., and Bentonville, Ark.
