STUNG BY BEE, GIRL DIES IN 20 MINUTES

Quebec Girl Bitten on Lip, Goes Almost at Once into Coma

MONTREAL, July 23.—(Canadian Press).—Stung by a bee, Jeanne Dube, 13 years of age, died 20 minutes after at her father's bee farm at St. Bruno. The girl had been trying to prevent a bee from stinging a boy, while they were in the farm laboratory, and the insect stung her on the lower lip. Five minutes after she was stung she became unconscious, and despite the efforts of a doctor who was called, she remained in that state until she died. Mr. Dube told the doctor that his daughter had been stung many times by bees, as their farm was quite large, having over 125 hives, but that the stings had had no ill effects other than a temporary pain, and she had never shown any signs of being ill after being stung. The boy Leroux was stung on the foot by a bee, which had been trying to take some honey from a part of an old bit of honey comb. The lad stopped to chase away the insect, and when he did so, Jean Dube saw that another bee had entered beneath his head netting and that he was in danger of being stung in the face. She seized the netting and tore it from his head, releasing the bee, which stung her on the lower lip.

ROUGH WORK OF LIQUOR SQUAD

Edmonton Jockey Alleges That Alberta Enforcement Men "Beat Him Up."

EDMONTON, July 23.—His face and throat marked by scratches and ugly marks, George Yeargin, the jockey of Cuba, a horse belonging to the Baby Shoe string, told of how he had been choked, assaulted and dragged to a waiting car by detectives of the provincial liquor enforcement squad at the fair grounds, when he gave evidence before Magistrate McLeod in the police court during the trial of a man Conrad, who was alleged to have sold beer in a dining car belonging to the midway organization. Yeargin himself faced a charge of illegal possession, and the protection of the court was first asked for him by Eardley Jackson, his lawyer.

He denied, when cross examined by Inspector Schurer, that he had attempted to resist arrest. "There's a lot of stick-up guys follow these shows around," he declared, "and that's why I ran when I heard them holler." He added that a light man like himself did not have much chance against three big detectives, and they had not told him that he was under arrest until they had dragged him into the car.

"Who were the men that attacked you?" asked W. R. Howson, who was appearing for Conrad. "Oh, some of these dicks," responded the jockey, viglently waving his arm around the courtroom. "That's one of them over there!" he dramatically added, pointing to a reporter, who paled when he heard this accusation.
