Awarded Contract by Skeena River Packing Co. for Two Fish Carriers

The Prince Rupert dry dock has been awarded a contract by the Skeena River Packing Co. for the building of two scows, 40 to 44 by 4, which are to be used in packing fish for the Port Edward cannery. They will be built of spruce lumber supplied by the Big Bay Lumber Co. Work on the contract will start at once, delivery to be made about June 15.

PREPARING FOR MINING WORK

Kalum Lake Properties to be Operated this Year Direction of J. M. Hoar

After having spent a day in town making arrangements for the obtaining of men and material to be used in connection with further development work on mining properties this season in the Kitsumkalum Lake district, Ex-Governor Davis of Idaho, J. T. Ball of Roseburg, Oregon, and J. M. Hoar of Seattle proceeded to Terrace on this morning's train. The Hopper-Davis interests will start work first this year on the Little Beaver property, but will also carry out work on other prospects around Kitsumkalum Lake. It is possible they may acquire further holdings than the eight or nine properties they have now in their hands. It is expected to employ some twenty or so local men and the work, as in the past, will be under the direction of Mr. Hoar. Ex-Governor Davis also expects to spend the most of the season in the district.

FISH ARRIVALS

Two American and One Canadian Sold Catches at Exchange This Morning

Two American boats and one Canadian sold catches of halibut at the Fish Exchange this morning. Prices were 16.6c and 16.7c and 9c for American fish and 15.3c and 8.5c for Canadian. The American boats were the Grant with 27,000 pounds and the Lumen with 13,000 pounds, and the Canadian boat was the White Lily with 2,500 pounds.

SYNOD OPENED ITS SESSIONS

Committees and Delegates Appointed and General Business Carried on

The Anglican synod of the Diocese of Caledonia opened its sessions yesterday afternoon and continued in the evening and is still going on today. There was a full attendance of clerical and lay delegates with the one exception of Rev. Commander Hodgson of Telegraph Creek who was unable to get out.

The first business was the appointment of Rev. A. W. R. Ashley of Stewart as hon. clerical secretary.

The administrator of the diocese, Archdeacon Rix, gave a report of the work of the diocese since the last synod meeting and welcomed the new members into it.

Committees were formed to deal with the report, the members being Rev. Canon Rushbrook, Rural Dean Marsh and Rev. G. Gray.

C. V. Eviit was appointed secretary-treasurer of the diocese and E. Unwin auditor. Delegates and committees follow:

Last evening the delegates were entertained at supper by the W.A. of St. Andrews Cathedral in the Cathedral Hall at which a vote of thanks to the ladies was proposed by Archdeacon Rix and replied to by Thomas Adams of Massett.

The financial report of the diocese was read by C. V. Eviit, and also the report of the executive committee.

This morning a service was held in the Cathedral. Rev. E. Hodson of Ocean Falls preaching the sermon and this was followed by lunch in the Cathedral Hall.

The bride was attired in full wedding costume including white gown, veil and bouquet. Two little native girls, daintily attired, acted as flower girls. The ceremony took place in the presence of a congregation of some fifty persons.

After the church service, the party proceeded downtown where the occasion was duly celebrated with banquet, etc.
