BLACKWOOD on Bridge

You're Still Ahead When You "Lose One, Gain Two"

Mr. Abel's "stinginess" lost him this contract. Thousands of similar contracts are lost because of the declarer's unwillingness to follow the principle of "lose one, gain two."

Now, from the bidding, it appeared to Mr. Abel that the ace of spades was almost surely in Mr. Muzzy's hand. After pulling trumps, he led a spade and put up dummy's queen. But Mr. Dale showed up with the ace and he won and returned the jack of spades, driving out dummy's king.

With two tricks already lost, there was nothing lost to try but the diamond finesse and when that was wrong, the hand was set. On winning with the king of diamonds Mr. Muzzy managed to return a spade to Mr. Dale's good ten.

Mr. Abel's thinking didn't go far enough. True, the bidding indicated that Mr. Muzzy had some high cards outside the club suit. He might have both the king of diamonds and the ace of spades, but surely he had one or the other.

The best play, then, was to lead a little diamond from the closed hand at trick three. If Mr. Muzzy had the king he would have to play it or go without any diamond tricks. And when he did, two spades could be discarded later on the third and fourth diamond leads.

If Mr. Dale did turn up with the king of diamonds, then the ace of spades had to be in Mr. Muzzy's hand and successive leads up to the king-queen of spades in dummy would hold the losers in that suit to one.
