VANCOUVER, July 15 .- Excessive instalment buying is a menace and danger to unsecured creditors, such as wholesalers and retailers, and to the prosperity of business in general, declared Stanley Windle, of Regina, Sask., who today addressed the Dominion convention delegates of the Canadian Credit Men's Trust Association on "Instalment Selling from the Wholesalers Viewpoint."

"I am not opposed to instalment buying, but I am opposed to lit when it encourages an over-|consumption of luxuries," said Mr. Windle.
