## PREMIER OLIVER BASES HIS PEACE RIVER CLAIMS ONLY ON MORAL RIGHT

### Premier Oliver Relies on Moral Right of B.C. for a Claim on Ottawa

Tells Vancouver Canadian Club experience of Province as member of Confederation not fully satisfactory

VANCOUVER, Feb. 6 .- While maintaining the principle that confederation was right, British Columbia's experience as whole had "not been fully satisfactory." Premier Oliver told a meeting of the Canadian Club here last night.
