## PUBLICITY FOR CITY PLANNED

Board of Trade Committees Have Matter in Hand Following Meeting Last Night

### GRAIN AND MINING

Suggestion is Made that Newspaper Advertising Would be Better than Booklet

The Board of Trade last night instructed the publicity committee to co-operate with the Grain Committee and the city council in a scheme of publicity for this year and to report back to a future meeting of the Board or the executive.

The matter was introduced when H. F. Pullen, on behalf of the publicity committee, recommended that the board try to co-operate with the city in preparing a booklet as was done last year, but that this time the scheme be to feature Prince Rupert as a grain port. He said he had consulted with John Dybbavn, chairman of the joint committee last year, and he was strongly in favor of the plan. It was thought that a booklet of sixteen pages and cover instead of twenty as last year, would answer the requirements and this would cost, it was estimated, \$550 for five thousand copies. Last year the cost was \$627.

### In Newspapers

Another scheme suggested by the publicity committee was that a newspaper advertising campaign be carried on in Alberta and Saskatchewan in conjunction with the grain committee and that this be started at once. Mr. Pullen asked the board to authorize a sum not exceeding \$400 as a beginning.

Colonel J. W. Nicholls was rather sceptical of the benefits received from the publication of a booklet and advocated rather the spending of the money in newspaper advertising. He said that his firm had discarded booklet advertising a long time ago as not bringing results. They found the other kind brought direct returns.

G. W. Nickerson urged that wheat and mining be featured in any scheme that was planned. He thought the board should concentrate on those two subjects.


