

YORK, Jan. 27 .- (By Canadian Press). - Two United States engineers, W. H. Sawyer, of Columbus, Ohio, and H. W. Earles, of St. Louis, Mo., will sail for Australia early in February to make a survey of elecric power resources of that country, according to Sir James Elder, commissioner for Australia in the United States. Officially they have been appointed by the government of the state of lictoria to "investigate and report on the Yallourn brown coal electricity generation scheme and connected power undertakings of the government electricity commission." 

Having died a few hours previous in the cabin which he occupied on Digby Island, the body of Alfred Parker, a Metlakatla Indian, was brought to the city! late yesterday afternoon by Dominion Constable A. J. Watkinson and Provincial Constable Fred Markland. The remains had been found by a fisherman, John McKay, who lived nearby and who notified the police.

The death was apparently from natural causes. Parker was ! known to have been ill for two! or three days previous and, when his remains were found. hey were doubled up indicating the man had been suffer-
