LA ROSE MINE SHOULD SHIP THIS SEASON

Annual Meeting of Company Held Here Hears Reports

The annual meeting of the shareholders of the Alice Arm-La Rose Mining Co., Ltd took place yesterday afternoon at the office of E. H. Mortimer, secretary-treasurer of the company, which is also the registered office of the concern. Several local shareholders, as well as some from Alice Arm, were in attendance.

Miles Donald, Joseph Wells, and Neil Forbes of Alice Arm and Dr. W. T. Kergin and James H. Thompson of Prince Rupert were elected directors with E. H. Mortimer, secretary-treasurer, and J. Lorne MacLaren, auditor.

Miles Donald, president and managing director of the company, gave a good report on work that had been done and results obtained during the past year. He stated that 320 feet of tunnel had been driven in from the side hill and that an upraise had been started. Within ten feet of the upraise, a two foot ledge of high grade silver ore had been encountered. The upraise, being continued, was now at a height of 66 feet from the level of the tunnel and was still in the ore ledge of the same width. It was the intention to continue driving the upraise some seventy feet until the bottom of the old shaft was struck. Here it was known that the same ledge of ore existed.

Such buildings as cook-house and ore sorting sheds will have to be erected and the trail from the mine to the Dolly Varden Railway track a distance of about two miles, will have to be brushed out and renewed before shipping can start. It is expected that the first shipments will be made before the end of the present season.

The meeting decided that no more shares would be put on the market at the old rate of 50c but that a block of fifty thousand shares would be offered at the par value of \$1. The money will be used in continuing development work.

At a directors' meeting, which followed the shareholders' meeting, Miles Donald was re-elected president of the company and Dr. W. T. Kergin, vice-president.

HEAVYWEIGHT BOXER COMES

Charles Penwill of Goldstreams Guards and Fistic Fighter Among Settlers

WINNIPEG, April 4.—An almost perfectly double for Dempsey before he had his face "lifted" arrived here this morning on the third Canadian National immigrant special this week, in the person of Charles Penwill, late of the famous Goldstream Guards and for three years holder of the Imperial Service Heavyweight championship, the ex-guardian who is seeking a fortune in western Canada was one of the 405 Britishers on the train from the S.S. Antonia, the majority of whom have come out under the 3000 family scheme to take up lands.

After eleven years in the Guards and a series of matches with British and European champions Penwill went back to the land for a short period but was unsuccessful in making it pay owing to the high rents prevailing in England. His last fight was in Portugal last February but several months out of work were not conducive to physical fitness for boxing so he decided to come to Canada where he was confident he could obtain sufficient hard work to put him back into condition. He hopes then to get some bouts in this country and if hard work is all he needs for training he is going the right way about getting it, having applied to the C.N.R. colonization department for a farm job. Perhaps if Penwill wins a few matches in this country on this new kind of training, some Canadian and American fighters might give the system a try-out.
