month.

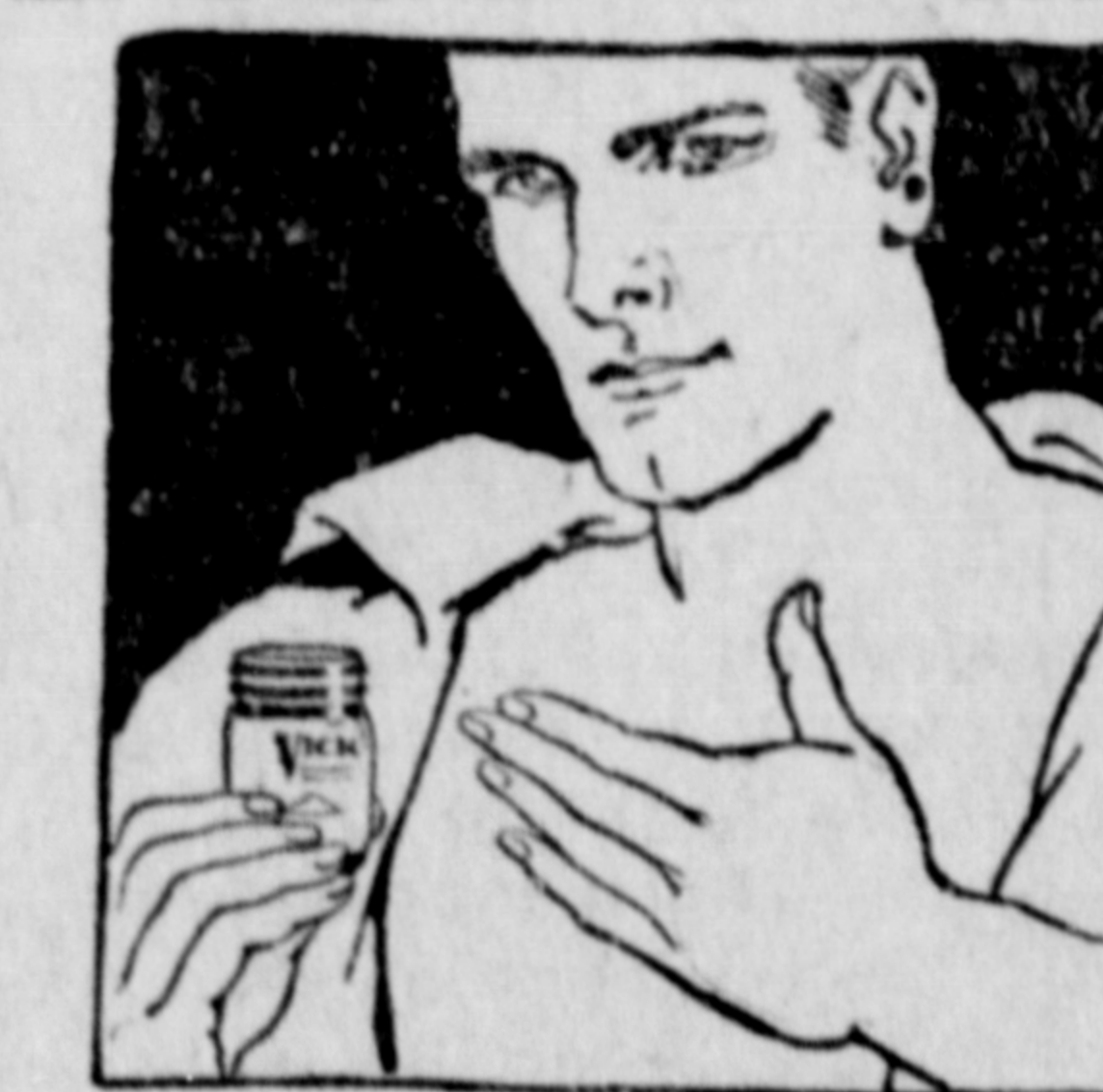
The hospital board last night
