REGULATIONS GAME SEASON

Open Season For 1926 and Bag Limits Are Announced.

VICTORIA, July 24.—The open season for game in what is described as the western district of the province has been fixed by new regulations just announced by the attorney general's department, together with the bag limits for the eastern, northern and western districts. The western district covers the coast territory from the Atlin electoral district southward and west of the Cascades.

The new regulations as to open seasons are as follows:

Mountain Goat — Throughout the western district (except Vancouver Island), open season from September 11, 1926 to December 15, 1926, both dates inclusive.

Bear (except white or kermode bear) — Throughout the western district, open season from September 11, 1926, to June 15, 1927, both dates inclusive.

Deer (mule, white-tail and coast) — Bucks only, throughout the western district (except the Queen Charlotte Islands and those portions of Vancouver Island known as North and South Saanich and Highland districts), open season from September 11, 1926, to December 15, 1926, both dates inclusive.

Fur-Bearing Animals
In the western district, all fur-bearing animals (except muskrats on Vancouver Island and beaver throughout the district), open season from December 1, 1926, to March 31, 1927, both dates inclusive.

Beaver — In the electoral districts of Prince Rupert, Skeena and Mackenzie situate and lying in the western district, open season from February 15, 1927, to March 31, 1927, both dates inclusive.

Game Birds
Ducks — Wilson, snipe, coots, greater and lesser yellowlegs, in the western district, open season from October 15, 1926, to January 31, 1927, both dates inclusive.

Geese and Brant, in the western district, open season from November 1, 1926, to February 15, 1927, both dates inclusive.

Grouse (blue only), in the western district, September 11 to October 31, inclusive.

Grouse (willow only) — November 1 to November 31, inclusive.

Quail — Open season from November 1, 1926, to November 30, 1926; both dates inclusive.

Bag Limits
Bag limits for the northern, eastern and western districts are defined as follows:

In respect of big game throughout the province as defined in the "Game Act" no person shall anywhere in the northern and eastern districts kill or take or have in their possession during the open season more than two deer, all of which must be of the male sex; and in the western district kill or take or have in their possession during the open season more than three bear of any species other than grizzly, and north of the main line of the Canadian National Railway, formerly known as the Grand Trunk Railway, two grizzly bear, and south of the said railway line one grizzly bear.

In the portion of the province north of the main line of the Canadian National Railway, formerly known as the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway, no person shall at any time kill or take or have in their possession during the open season more than two mountain sheep of any one species or three altogether of the male sex.

Throughout the province no person shall at any time kill or take or have in their possession during the open season more than two mountain goat.

Game Birds
No person shall in any district hereinafter designated kill or take on any one day, any greater number of game birds than the daily bag limit hereinafter set out respectively nor kill or take or have in their possession during the open season any greater number of game birds than the total bag limits set out.

Ducks (throughout the province) — Daily bag limit, 20, total bag limit, 150.

Geese — Daily bag limit, 10; total bag limit, 50.
