CANADIAN BOY HELD IN JAIL

TRIED TO ENTER UNITED STATES WITHOUT PAPERS AND HELD AT BORDER FOR MONTHS

EDMONTON, Nov. 30.—Languishing in jail at Minot, North Dakota where he has been held for five months and threatened with deportation to England, Claude Pollock, a former Edmonton boy, has appealed to friends here to effect his release. Pollock tried to enter the States without the necessary papers. The matter has been brought to the attention of Mayor Blatchford who will at once take it up with Hon. Robert Forke, minister of immigration. "This close confinement is ruining my health and it seems as if I am to remain here for a considerable time yet as the federal authorities cannot get in touch with my people," says the boy's pleading letter.

PASSPORTS ARE REQUIRED
This case contains a warning to Canadians against entering the United States without having the necessary passport. It appears that Pollock was arrested by a U.S. immigration officer when it was found that he did not have the requisite papers.

The appeal has aroused sympathy of officials here, especially as Pollock underwent a surgical operation some months ago.

Pollock says that he worked for the Chisholm Lumber company for two years and then went to Hutton, B.C. Afterwards he went to Vancouver and then to North Dakota where he got work on a farm. It was while working there that he was arrested by the immigration officer.

WOULD RETURN TO CANADA
"In the event of my being deported to England, I will find myself in a country where employment is extremely scarce, without clothes, no home and no folks to go to," says the letter.

Pollock points out further that if someone with influence would intercede in his behalf he might avoid deportation to England in his destitute condition and be returned to Canada.


Financial Post Says Earnings This Year are \$20 per Share

GERMAN FAMILIES COMING TO CANADA

WINNIPEG, Nov. 30.—Dr. F. Schneider, of Berlin, Germany, has completed details in connection with the sale of the W. B. Bennett, 3-100 acre farm between Winnipeg and Selkirk to thirty German families, whom he represented.

The property will be divided into 100-acre farms on which intensified farming will be conducted. The price is in the neighborhood of \$125,000, part of which is being paid over. It was stated by officials of the Canada Colonization Association, which along with German-Canadian Catholic Association, is negotiating the deal. The new settlers will come out from Germany in the early spring, it is expected.

WOMAN WINNER OF AUTOMOBILE TROPHY

LONDON, Nov. 30.—The first woman to win the Dewar Motor Trophy of the Royal Automobile Club is Miss Violet Cordery, of Cobham, Surrey. The trophy is awarded annually for the most meritorious performance in a certified trial. The trial Miss Cordery won consisted of a high speed reliability test of a 19.6 h.p. car, which was driven for 70 hours 59 1/2 minutes and covered a distance of 5016.2 miles, at an average speed of 73.8 h.p.
