**CROP REPORTS  
ARE FAVORABLE**

Rains on July 7 Kept Grain Growing.—B. C. Dry Belt is Suffering.

The Bank of Montreal crop report says in part:

Prospects continue favorable in the three prairie provinces. Rains were fairly general on 7th instant in Manitoba and eastern Saskatchewan and scattered in western Saskatchewan and Alberta. Wheat is generally in shot blade and is heading out in some sections. In Quebec Province recent showers and warm weather have assisted to some extent in overcoming the effects of the lateness of spring, but in several districts rain is badly needed. In Ontario weather conditions during the past two weeks have been ideal and all crops show a decided improvement. In the maritime provinces recent growing conditions have been favorable and crops are doing well. In British Columbia also weather conditions on the whole have been favorable except in the dry belt.

**Alberta**

Western area.—Conditions are very satisfactory. There is a good growth with sufficient moisture for the present. Northeastern Area.—Prospects continue favorable, except in small strip 25 to 60 miles from Edmonton, which requires moisture. Southeastern Area.—General conditions are somewhat favorable, although some localities cannot expect more than a light yield.

**Saskatchewan**

Northern Area.—Wheat is growing well and is now in shot blade, but good rains are needed to ensure a satisfactory yield. Southern Area.—With warm weather wheat is making satisfactory progress. It is practically in shot blade with early wheat heading out. Rain is needed in some districts, but generally speaking there is sufficient moisture for the present. On the whole the outlook is satisfactory.

**Manitoba**

Rainfalls have not been evenly distributed and as a result reports vary considerably. On the whole growth is satisfactory, although generally short. The rye crop is poor.

**British Columbia**

A good crop of hay has been cut except in the dry belt where intense heat and shortage of moisture, combined with grasshopper plague, are affecting pasture and field crops. Grain is well advanced. Potatoes, roots and other vegetables are doing well. The fruit crops will probably yield the following percentages of average: Apples, 105 per cent; pears 100 per cent; cherries 80 per cent; plums and prunes 110 per cent; raspberries 75 per cent; hops 100 per cent; tomatoes 80 per cent. Pasturage is good.

**WATER NOTICE****Use and Storage**
