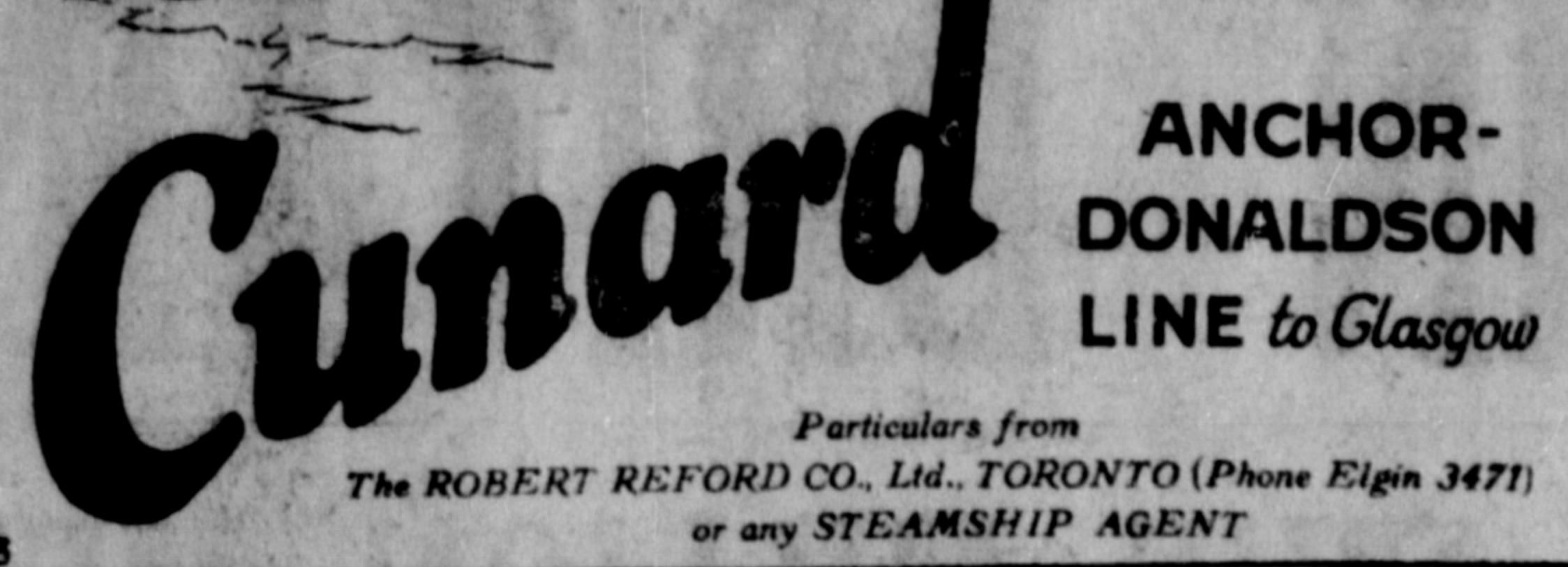

WATERFRONT WHIFFS

New tugboat being planned for Bushby fleet-- harbor master on the job--engines and boats much in demand

Plans are being prepared for a new tugboat for the Bushby fleet. The vessel will be 65 feet in length over all with 16 foot beam and depth of seven feet six inches.

Mr. Bushby states that it has not yet been definitely decided where the new boat will be built, but in compliance with Bushby policy, it will be constructed here if at all possible.

A tank car of fish oil was shipped East from the Rupert Marine Products plant this week.

Harbor regulations in Prince Rupert will be better lived up to from now on than they ever were before if the new harbor master, Capt. H. C. Marsh, is able to carry out his plans along that line.

It was found impossible to salvage A. T. Eckoff's gasoline boat Leinsh, which went on the rocks of Bonilla Island in a storm recently.

T. J. Tingley and B. L. Tingley, pioneer residents of the Massett Inlet district, arrived from the south this week on their way to the Queen Charlotte Islands where they will again engage in the fishing industry this season.

Returning after a week's trip to Ketchikan, the Prince Rupert Boat House power boat Pachena, Capt. Paul Armour, proceeded immediately to Port Clements having on board F. L. Buckley and party who will inspect the sawmill that is being reopened there by Mr. Buckley.

A mystery fishing ship which, it is claimed, will revolutionize the fishing industry, is now being built at Hull, England.

She is much bigger than the ordinary fishing vessel, her tonnage being between 4,000 and 5,000, and instead of trawling out in the ordinary way, she will anchor outside territorial waters and send out small whal boats to fish with lines.

When the fish are brought aboard they will be laid in specially constructed "rest bunks" to prevent the crushing and spoiling that occurs when fish are carried in bulk, and also to keep them alive until landed.

Halibut arrivals during the past week were unusually light totalling (from Saturday to Friday inclusive) only 440,000 lbs., which is just about half of average.

The total landings for the season to date are as follows: American, 5,368,600 pounds; Canadian, 1,671,800 pounds; total 7,043,400 pounds.
