Results of Efficiency Tests Made Last Year put Prince Rupert in Second Place

Smithers leads this district in quality of exhibits and support of its fair according to an efficiency test made by the Department of Agriculture, the returns of which have just been announced. Smithers' percentage is 76.4 and Prince Rupert comes second with 61.2. BRUCE ELECTS JURY TRIAL AND HEARN IS GIVEN SIX MONTHS

Neil Bruce, charged with assaulting City Police Sergeant Hugh McGlinchy with intent, and Edward Hearn, charged in the same connection with obstructing a police officer, appeared before Judge Young in the County Court yesterday afternoon. Bruce elected for jury trial so will come up at the session of the Supreme Court assizes next month. Hearn pleaded guilty and was sentenced to six months' imprisonment at Okalla. Inspector William Spiller, provincial police, prosecuted.
