# GREAT FAITH

BELIEVES IN CANADA AND HIS OWN ABILITY TO MAKE RAILWAY SUCCESS

VICTORIA, Nov. 8 .- "We who live in Canada have much to be thankful for, we have reason to be proud of the past and to be confident of our future. Our present problems, in the light of the passing years will prove to be small ones after all, just as those of the past appear to have been now. Our posi-We stand high among the nations enjoying their respect and their confidence and in that great commonwealth which forms the British Empire we stand first. In my mind Canada is today the best economic bet of any country on the face of the earth."

In these words Sir Henry W. Thornton, chairman and president of the Canadian National Railways epitomized his thoughts on the present and future status of Canada in a thanksgiving address to the Canadian Club of Victoria at noon today.

EVENTS PROVE IT

Sir Henry who was introduced by the president of the club, as the super-optimist of the Dominion, acknowledged the charge with "almost criminal cheerfulness," but he stated that he thought that the events of the past few years and the steady progress which Canada has been making, more than justified his highest expressions of faith in the

Had I not had unlimited faith in the future of Canada and in the ability of the Canadian National Railways to become an issue of great value to the people of the Dominion, I never would have accepted the position which I now occupy and had I found my faith unfounded I would not have remained."

In dealing specifically with the position of British Columbia Sir Henry said he looked forward with a great deal of confidence to the future of the province. It is a matter on which the people of the province could be complimented that they had been able to make such excellent progress in the past few years and he believed that a continued application of the same industry, zeal, and confidence in the conduct of their affairs would make British Columbia the most important section of the whole Pacific slope.
