## AERIAL PATROL IS CANCELLED

Chief Inspector of Fisheries Here to Make Arrangements For Other Means of Protection

To make arrangements for other means that will have to be devised to patrol the salmon fisheries during the forthcoming season now that the aerial patrol has had to be cancelled because of slashing reductions in the estimates for the Royal Canadian Air Force, Major J. A. Motherwell, chief inspector of fisheries, and John W. Allen, superintendent engineer for the department, arrived in the city from the south on the Prince George this morning. They expect to return south Friday morning.

With prospects pointing to more intensive fishing than ever before this season, the cancelling of the aerial patrol this year is a matter of much disappointment to Major Motherwell. By hiring patrol boats, etc., the cost of the work of administering the regulations and protecting the fisheries will be three times as much as it would be with the planes and there will not be the same efficiency. Though, as matters now stand, it looks as if the department has lost the aerial patrol, Major Motherwell still may be reconsideration of the express hope that "there matter."

## DRY DOCK GETS FURTHER WORK

Three C.G.M.M. Freighters Coming in Near Future—New Construction Likely

Prospects for obtaining contracts for new ship construction work at the local dry dock are very favorable states Thomas Loudon, general superintendent of the plant, who arrived from Vancouver this morning on the Prince George on a regular trip of inspection. Mr. Loudon announces that between now and July 1 there will probably be three of the Canadian Government Merchant Marine ocean-going freighters brought here for annual overhaul.

The dry dock is still busy on the construction of the large motor vessel for Okanagan Lake service and it should be ready to ship to Kelowna within a few weeks' time. The steel work is just about finished and work is progressing on the machinery and interior fittings.

Mr. Loudon will return to Vancouver Friday morning.

## SOCIAL ILLS AND CAUSES

Professor of University of B.C. Says Poverty Not Necessarily Fault of Individual

VICTORIA, April 20.—Social ills and their causes, an analysis of basic human needs and the necessity of their gratification, formed the theme of a lecture delivered by Professor Beckett of the University of British Columbia at the Victoria College as a part of the University Extension course program. Social evils, said the speaker, arose out of a maladjustment of society.

Human life, said Professor Beckett, from a social point of view, is one unit of which every part affects the other even more intimately than the sensitively organized nerves affect the body, which are constantly in inter-communication.

## Failure to Harmonize

As poor physical health is the outcome of bodily maladjustment; so social evil was the result of society's failure to harmonize in all its parts.

Society failed to realize, said the Professor, that when certain changes were made in its complex system it was necessary for it to change in other directions, readjust itself, if it were to retain its unity.

Society grew in a very irregular way, said the speaker, one part forging ahead while the other lagged behind. Between the economic process and the legal process there was a vast difference. There was maladjustment here, he said. An improved educational system is necessary, as education falls behind the developing complexity of human life, while religious teaching falls behind social conditions, he asserted.

## Various Causes

Changing environment caused individual maladjustment. This resulted in poverty, vice, crime, divorce and the wrecking of homes, among other evils.

Poverty, many claimed, was the fault of the individual, said Professor Beckett, but he reminded his hearers that the individual's life was socially conditioned, and therefore society had to accept some of the responsibility for poverty existing in its midst.

Society moves slowly, said the speaker. He pointed out that this is an educational process, and there may come a time when its resources will be more evenly distributed so that its members may all possess the means of gratifying the basic needs of life, thus making universally possible those intellectual pursuits, spiritual experiences and social recreations which contribute to the progress of society.

## HOSPITAL WING FOR VICTORIA

Cost of Addition to Big Catholic Institution to be about \$400,000.

VICTORIA, April 20.— Construction of the new wing at the St. Joseph's Hospital will commence in about a month, according to an announcement made by Bishop O'Donnell, of Victoria. The work will cost approximately \$400,000 to complete.

In speaking of the extension the Bishop stated that upon the completion of the wing the St. Joseph's Hospital will have one of the finest hospitals on the continent. The new building will be equipped with the most modern devices known to the surgical world.

The work will take about a year to complete. The plans are still in the hands of the architects and the contract for the work will be let in the course of a few weeks.

St. Joseph's is a Catholic institution under control of the church but catering largely to Protestant as well as Catholic patients.
