ROSE HOFFMAN IS IN COURT

Charged With Doing Grievous Bodily Harm by Throwing Lysol in Man's Face

After considerable evidence had been taken, the case of Rose Hoffman, charged with doing grievous bodily harm to Einar Anderson, at her house on Comox Avenue on the morning of June 13, was adjourned for eight days by Magistrate McLymont in the city police court this morning. L. W. Patmore acted for the defence and E. F. Jones, city solicitor, for the prosecution. Alderman Larson was court interpreter.

Anderson, who is a Swede and who only arrived in Canada recently, stated he went down Comox Avenue early on the morning of June 13, and asked for beer at the Hoffman house. While drinking the beer at the sink he alleged the offence of throwing lysol in his face took place.

In reply to questions by Mr. Patmore he admitted drinking fifteen glasses of beer and six or seven strong drinks the night before the occurrence, which he did not consider was too much. He had started to drink about 4 or 5 o'clock on the afternoon previous. Witness said he had taken a meal down town on Saturday afternoon at a Chinese restaurant and had coffee and cake between 6 and 7 o'clock in the evening. His room mate had been with him on Comox Avenue
