

EDMONTON, Jan. 26-Formation of a provincial medical inspection board to deal with applicants for marriage licenses! may be considered shortly at a special meeting of the city board of health. This step was suggested at a meeting of the board but it was decided that the three members. Doctors Leitch, Orr, and Whitelaw should! obtain information on the subject and this will be considered at a later session.
