## Send Those Xmas Parcels Overseas Now

OTTAWA (CP)—It's time to start thinking about sending Christmas parcels and mail to soldiers and airmen overseas. Parcels and ordinary letters to troops in Japan and Korea must be posted to reach Vancouver; not later than Nov. 7. Airmail must arrive in Vancouver by Dec. 5.

Parcels for troops in Britain and Europe must be posted to reach Montreal not later than Nov. 25. Ordinary letters must reach Montreal by Nov. 27. The deadline for airmail is Dec. 14 at Montreal.

Weight limit on parcels to the Far East and Europe is 10 pounds by parcel post and four pounds, six ounces by airmail. Size and value regulations should be checked at local post offices.

Air mail should be properly addressed and fully prepaid at the postage rate for overseas delivery. A customs declaration form should be completed and attached to all parcel post.

## BLACKWOOD on Bridge

Dale's 'Guess' Is Right, but He Reasons First  
Mrs. Keen had enough to respond to her partner's opening bid of one heart. But she couldn't bid clubs. The reason is that her hand was not strong enough. To respond at the two level, you need at least an average hand in high cards. Add one king to Mrs. Keen's hand and she would have been barely justified in responding with two clubs.

Against the four-heart contract, Mr. Muzzy led the queen of spades. The ace killed dummy's king and Mr. Muzzy won the second trick with the 10 of spades. The suit was continued and Mr. Dale ruffed with the jack of hearts.

At this point the old master had to decide whether to go after clubs or diamonds for his 10 tricks. If Mr. Muzzy had exactly three clubs to the queen, that suit could be run, after trumps were extracted, and three diamonds from the closed hand discarded. But the odds were much against that distribution of the cards.

Mr. Dale properly decided to go after diamonds. He led the nine of hearts to dummy's 10. He returned the deuce of diamonds (not the nine) and finessed the jack. Mr. Muzzy won with the ace and led back a trump.

Mr. Dale then pulled all the outstanding trumps and had the king of clubs left in dummy for an entry. He led a club to the king and now pulled the nine of diamonds, dropping the eight from his hand when Mr. Champion refused to cover. This left the lead in dummy and another diamond finesse assured the making of the contract.

Note that Mr. Dale would have gone set if his first diamond lead from the board had been the nine. In that case the second diamond lead would have been taken in his own hand
