SAANICH ALSO HAS MILL RATE PROBLEM

Question of Taxing Improvements is Discussed and Tie of Council Results

VICTORIA, March 30.—Reeve Maenicol and councillors of the inner wards of Saanich will go before the people during the next two or three weeks to discuss the question of improvement taxation. This course was adopted by the Saanich Council when a vote on improvement taxation was delayed, as it was practically known beforehand that there would be a tie vote.

The same was the case with voting road appropriations, with the result that the entire question was left over to the next meeting. Saanich is in a position where it has only \$28,900 available for road work at the present mill rate, as compared with \$51,387 last year. Unless the mill rate is advanced three mills or improvement taxation is enforced, last year's appropriation cannot be voted. While the councillors from the inner wards are willing to vote for smaller appropriations to cut down expenses, it was the general opinion that

the roads would require more money in two years' time.

PAY OF NURSES IS CUT IN EDMONTON

Probationers to Serve Six Months Without Pay and Then Ten Dollars a Month

EDMONTON, March 30.—Reduction of nurses' salaries and elimination of sick pay for all members of the staff—such were two of the main decisions of the city hospital board at a meeting here. Both questions were strongly opposed by labor members who gave notice of motion that reconsideration would be asked at the next meeting. As previously reported, the wage cuts will not be effective until next year.

Under the motion by R. Sladden, which was passed, probationers will not receive pay for the first six months, while for the next six months they will be paid \$10 per month. The rate for the second and third years will be \$12 per month with board and lodging. At present, probationers receive \$10 per month for the first year, \$15 per month for the second year and \$20 per month for the third year.

GOOD FUR CATCH IN NORTHWESTERN ALASKA

Two Trappers Missing Thought to Have Been Drowned: Mildest Winter in Ten Years

SEWARD, March 30.—Fifteen thousand dollars worth of mink, ermine, red, cross and blue fox and land otter pelts arrived here today aboard the steamer Starr from the westward. It comprised one of the last shipments of the year.

Captain A. C. Goss has returned to Unalaska from Umnak, Atka and Attu Islands with a boat load of furs, after having had a successful season. He reported the mildest winter in ten years, but a splendid one for trappers.

Goss owns several islands stocked with fox, and enjoys an excellent return from them. Unalaska residents believe that A. Merrill and G. Shugar, trappers missing since October, were drowned. They were employed by the Kanaga Ranching Company to rid the islands of red foxes so that they could be restocked with blues. They were formerly employed by Carl Armstrong of Kodiak for similar work.

The bill, which calls for the provision of moneys for this purpose and which will increase the amount of the trading account of the department to about \$150,000 comes into effect on the order of the lieutenant governor in council if it passes the House.
