## 300-Year-Old Indian Relics Found

BRANDON (CP)—Remnants of an Indian burial mound and village which flourished about 300 years ago have been located seven miles west of Brandon on the farm of Frank Stott.  
The site on the side of a bluff just north of the Assiniboine River was discovered by Dr. R. S. MacNeish, archaeologist with the National Museum, Ottawa.  
Dr. MacNeish and his assistants have been excavating in a mound on the Stott farm for the last three weeks, and completed their work this week.  
"The Stott mound is one of the best and most revealing burial mounds ever excavated in Manitoba," Dr. MacNeish said.  
It contained eight burials, seven of which were located in two pits dug by the Indians below the original ground surface. The eighth burial was that of a young child, and was intrusive after the mound was built.  
Stone arrow points, knives, scrapers, awls, bone tools and pottery sherds also were found.

## Civil Workers Seek Rights To Bargain

VICTORIA (CP)—Provincial government employees will continue to press for establishment of an impartial board of arbitration to decide all matters of dispute between themselves and the Cabinet.  
Question of bargaining procedure was discussed by delegates to the B.C. Government Employees Association's ninth annual convention here.  
Support to the resolution asking for right to arbitrate was 100 per cent.  
E. P. O'Connor, general secretary of the association, in his annual report claimed civil servants were being relegated to second-class citizenship since they were denied bargaining procedure provided by law to all other workers.  
The resolution adopted did not ask that the Employees' Association be brought under the I.C.A. Act. The Act provides the right to strike.

## Wood Tanks Approved For New Housing

City council has granted Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation permission to construct wooden septic tanks for three homes in the new housing development on Atlin Avenue.  
The move was approved at a meeting Monday on recommendation of the board of works committee.  
CMHC inspector William De Silva had requested the authority at the last council meeting.  
The works committee suggested the wooden tanks would suffice until the city constructs a sewer line past the homes in question and council concurred.  
Alderman Darrow Gomez asked if the health officer's ruling that the wooden tanks could not be built had been clarified and city clerk Bill Long said the matter had been cleared up satisfactorily.  
Mr. Long explained that Council gives the health officer the right to make rulings, and his instructions can be appealed to council which has the authority to over-rule.  
The health officer had ruled that CMHC must build cement tanks for the homes after Mr. De Silva requested permission to construct wooden boxes until a sewer is built past the homes.

## Police Find No Clue to Missing Body

VANCOUVER (CP)—Lower mainland police are baffled over the mysterious disappearance of an Indian fisherman who was last reported tied to the mast of his 30-foot fishing boat in the Fraser River on Oct. 3.  
The missing man is Chester Slah, an unmarried Indian fisherman from Barnston Island.  
Meagre reports on Slah's disappearance stated that he and a 20-year-old youth, whose identity has not been revealed, sailed from the Johnson Cannery, on the Delta-Surrey border, for New Westminster Oct. 3.  
Slah is said to have done considerable drinking in the city, and to have been lashed to the mast to prevent him falling overboard when they started the return trip from New Westminster.  
Fog settled over the river and the boat tossed aimlessly for hours during which time, the youth said, Slah disappeared.  
It was not until two days later that the disappearance was reported.  
Police then found stains on the boat's deck which resembled human blood. Scrapings were sent to the Vancouver city analyst for a report.  
The 20-year-old youth has been instructed by police to remain near his home until the investigation continues.  
Meanwhile, no trace has been found of the missing man's body, although it is assumed that he was drowned.

## Beer-by-Phone Tavern Booming

HUNTINGTON, Norfolk, England (Reuters)—Tavern-keeper Peter Turner reports booming business as the result of his beer-by-telephone service for "henpecked" U.S. Air Force husbands.  
Turner promises to deliver beer by the glass or bottle within five minutes of a telephone call to his "hole-in-the-wall" public house. He said he inaugurated the system after U.S. Air Force men and their families moved into the area.
