### MARS UNINHABITED SAYS ASTRONOMER

Director of National Observatory Does Not Believe in Martian

MONTREAL, Jan. 15. - Dr. Francois Henroteau, Director of the Astronomical Observatory of the Dominion Government at Ottawa, does not believe there is any human or near-human population on Mars. Nor does he believe that any of the other solar planets are inhabited. Dr. Henroteau expressed these views in the course of an illustrated lecture on "The Planets and Our Unknown Worlds" before the members of the Alliance Francaise here last night. Dr. Henroteau also expressed doubt as to the canals of Mars being canals at all, although admitting that he himself had seen ten of those peculiar lines which Lowell enthusiastically proclaimed to be canals, linking Martian oceans together.

The Director of the National Observatory showed that there was a snow-covered pole on Mars: that a great deal of the soil was reddish-brown, and probably vast stretches of desert land. The greenish areas on the screen were probably vegelation, forests, for the colors vary slightly with the seasons, as on the earth. There was little Mrs. M. 
