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### How Little Things Warp Our Judgment.

Saturday a United States vessel, the Boxer, was passing through the rather narrow but perfectly safe channel west of Kennedy Island. A flurry of snow obscured the vision and before the officers of the ship knew what was happening the Boxer was ashore on Whitecliff Island. The little snowflakes had warped the judgment enough to cause what might have been a catastrophe.

Every day similar things are happening. Had there been a blustering gale the vessel could have sought shelter safely but the little despised flurry of snow was fatal.

### Beware Of Little Things That Guide Our Destiny.

All through life it is the little things that affect us most. Sometimes only a suggestion sets us on a new path that may be right or wrong but which is very far from the one intended to be travelled. Even a glance of the eye has deflected many a man from his duty.

The obvious duty then is to study the little things. In business this has always been recognized and some wise man of long ago said: "Take care of the pennies and the pounds will take care of themselves." The idea is to be careful over the little things for the big things will be of such importance that we shall be sure to take care of them.

The housekeeper that looks after the details, the stenographer that does her work well, the workman that is careful to carry out and sometimes to anticipate orders, the mechanic that watches every spring and nut and bolt, all these know that they must be careful of the little things if they are to make a success of their work and of life.

The politician knows that he is seldom defeated at an election because of the broad party policies but rather because of very small things he has done or left undone. Attention to details is most important in all walks of life.

### Welcome Edmonton Visit In Summer.

If the Edmonton Board of Trade decides to visit Prince Rupert, the members will get a hearty welcome. The present trade relations between that city and this are not at present as satisfactory as they might be. Edmonton is the nearest city on the east and is the capital of Alberta and the largest centre of the C.N.R. west of Winnipeg except Vancouver. We buy some goods from Edmonton and they buy some from us but there might be a greater exchange of products and gradually, as this port develops, the business should increase.

One thing against doing business with Edmonton is the heavy freight rate. We are not suggesting that the railway is collecting higher tolls for the service than it ought, except on export grain and flour, but we do know that lower freight rates tend to increase business. Because of the competition and because of the large amount of business of that kind handled, the railway gives a low grain export rate. The domestic rate is much higher, so high in many cases that it cannot compete with the steamship rate to the southern Canadian and American cities so that business which otherwise would go east now goes south.

### Settlement Of Queen Charlottes.

It is only twenty years ago that the first settlers went to the east coast of Queen Charlotte Islands, taking up lands at Tlell. While the war and other causes hindered progress there, something has been done and with the completion of the road to Port Clements, settlement will be more rapid and development of the farms greater. Today there is a difficulty in getting produce to market. The Island market is limited and the difficulty of shipping by steamer is very great. Gradually these difficulties will be ironed out and greater progress will be made.

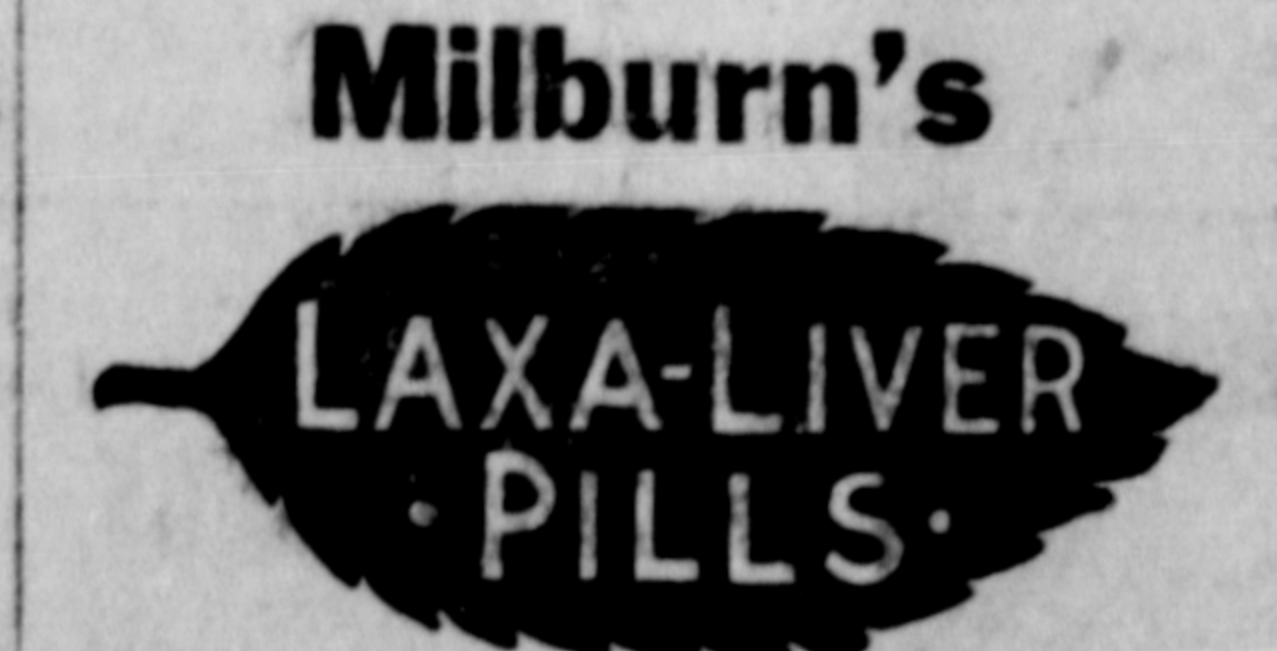
