



STORY OF EARLY DAYS

HOW INDIANS AND PIONEER WHITES WERE GIVEN AID BOTH PHYSI-CALLY AND RELIGIOUSLY

OCEAN FALLS, Dec. 14 .- At the invitation of Ocean Falls United Church official board, Dr. George E. Darby of Bella Bella Hospital, and Rev. J. C. Spencer of the Indian mission field. addressed the congregation recently on the work of the church. The service was in the interest of the maintenance and extension fund and there was a liberal response. Rev. Wm. Deans, the pastor, was in charge of the service.

Rev. Dr. Spencer told of the great changes wrought by the power of the gospel in the life of the Indian people. telling the story of "Slaughter Illie" at the opening of his address. This is a pretty spot at Rivers Inlet, near the entrance of Schooner Pass. Not so very long ago, after a tribal war, overtures for peace were made and both tribes were to meet at an appointed place. The Rivers Inlet Indians started in good faith and camped for the night at Schooner Pass. Their enemies, lying in ambush, sprang out and killed most of the warriors and the name "Slaughter Illie" (place of slaughter) was ! given to the spot.
