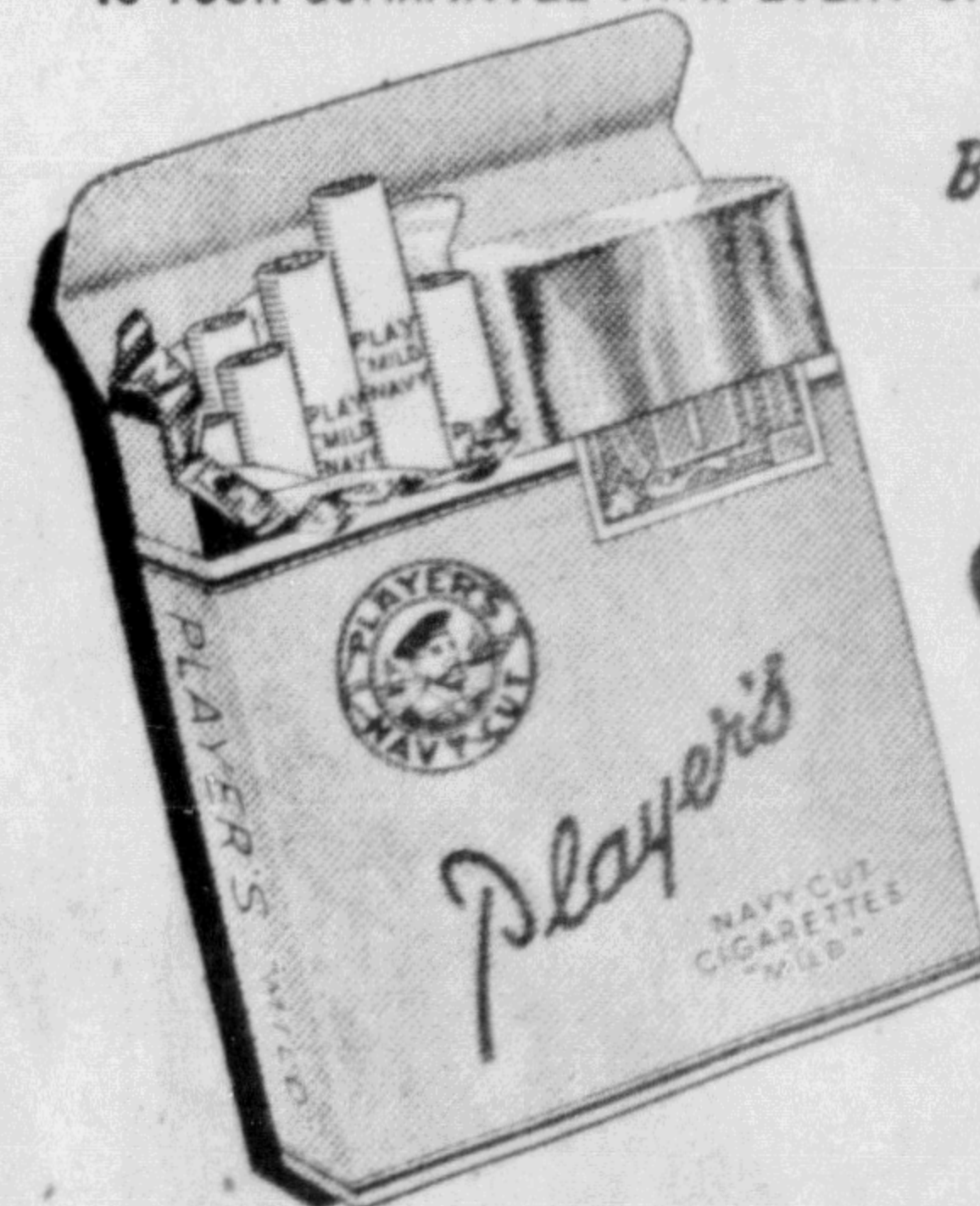

SCREEN ★ FLASHES

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—Cecil B. DeMille, still leading a vigorous pace at 71, is planning his next Biblical epic to hit the screens in 1955. His next project will be "The 10 Commandments."

"About this time next year, I expect to have a crew shooting backgrounds in Egypt," he said. "We plan to shoot at Mount Sinai and other real locations, and I may go along. The following spring, 1954, I will start the filming of the story here in Hollywood. That will take about six months, and the cutting and scoring takes about a year. That will bring us into late 1955."

"The actual shooting is the easiest part of making a picture. It is here in the production office that the picture is really created. A good story is everything. If you have that, the director and the stars do not make much difference. They can help the picture a little or hurt it a little. But they can't make a good script into a bad picture or a bad script into a good picture."

DeMille's research into Biblical history is thorough. He said his new project is difficult because of the obscurity of the Moses legend.

26 BLANK YEARS

"There is a lapse of 26 years between two verses of the Bible," he remarked. "One verse tells of Moses being found among the bullrushes, or papyrus, by the Pharaoh's daughter and in the next verse he is grown and has killed a man."

"We have to find out what happened to him between those two events. There is some data in such books as the Koran, Josephus and the Rabbinical writings. We learn that he was a great general, having conquered Ethiopia. Much of the rest has to be surmised."

"And what did the people wear and eat in those times. Did they eat roast beef or lamb chops or what? It would be as bad to show them eating the wrong things at it would to show them dressed in tails and top hat."

The producer said his new film will be loaded with spectacles, but the most notable will doubtless be the parting of the Red Sea. He has done it before, in his original "10 Commandments," filmed in 1922. (He explained the old version was a modern story with a flashback to the days of Moses, whereas the new film will deal strictly with the Biblical era.)

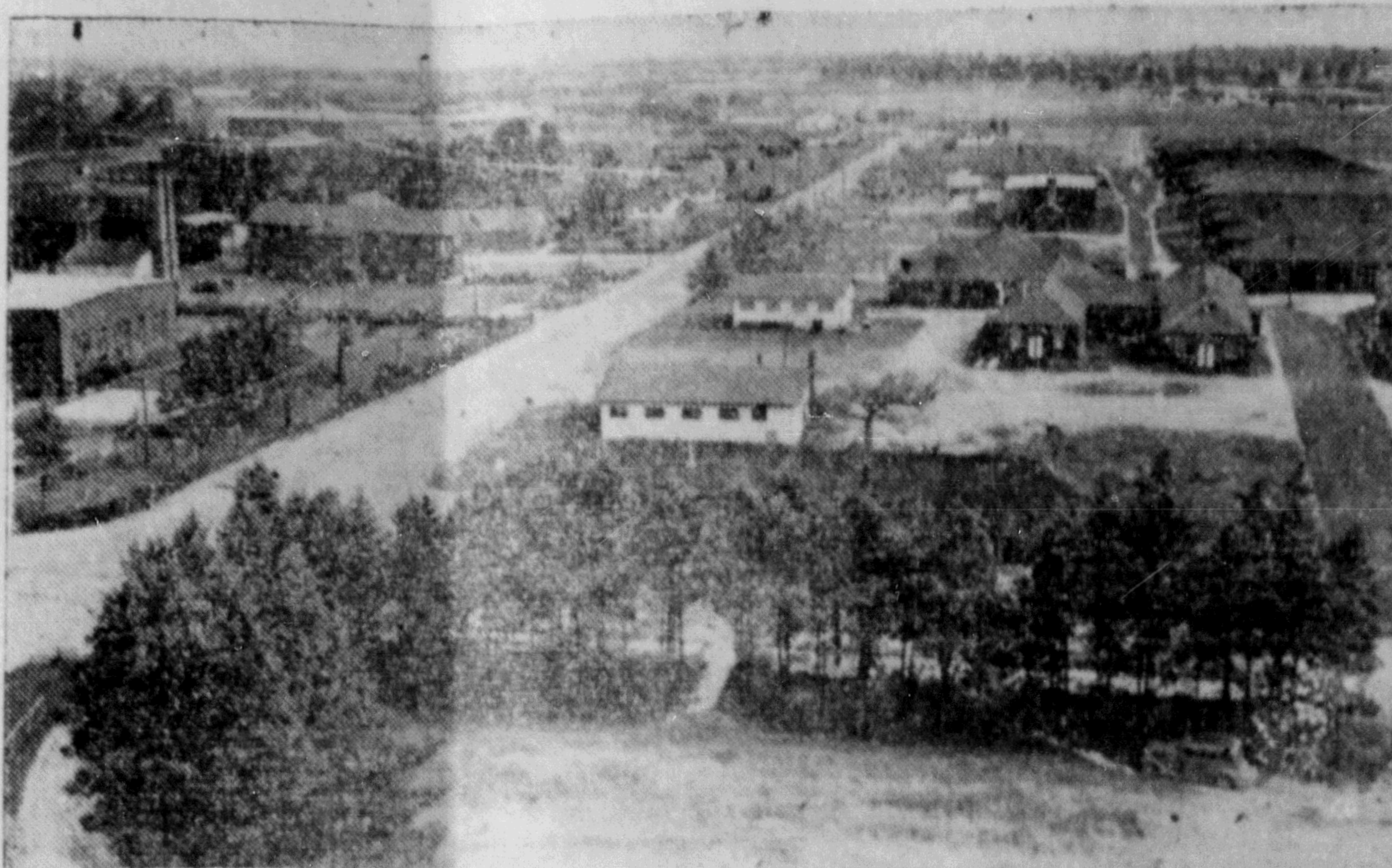
"I don't know how we will part the sea yet," he commented, "but we are already working on methods. We have come a long way in the film business since 30 years ago; this time the parting will have more basis in fact."

Napoleonic, Mussolinic Marriage

ROME (Reuters)—Mussolini's 18-year-old granddaughter, Raimonda Clano, has married a distant relative of Napoleon in an ancient church attached to the palace from which the Fascist dictator ruled Italy for 20 years.

Raimonda is the daughter of Edda Mussolini, the widow of Count Galeazzo Clano. Mussolini had Clano shot for treason in the last days of the Fascist regime.

The bridegroom, 23-year-old Sandro Giunta, is the son of a former Fascist party secretary. His mother, Marchioness Zenaida Rocca-Giovine del Gallo, is a descendant of Lucien Bonaparte, one of Napoleon's brothers.



ARMY'S UNIVERSITY—Camp Borden has been called the army's university because six separate schools train officers, non-commissioned officers and tradesmen. But the big camp, 72 miles north of Toronto, also is a self-contained community which costs \$1,000,000 a year to run. Oil, Gas Discovery in B.C. Explained In Report; First Oil Flow a Year Ago

Chronology of the discovery of B.C.'s first oil and gas field—almost astride the route of the chief gathering line from the north for the main pipe which will run from northern Alberta to the west coast—is the chief item of interest in a study of current petroleum development just issued by Empire Petroleum Limited.

The company, an independent with head office in Calgary, was a participant with Pacific Petroleum in the development at Fort St. John, major focal point of the drive to extend the boundaries of the western Canadian field.

One purpose of the study which has been published in booklet form is to place the oil and gas picture "in its proper frame of reference for the eastern reader."

First oil to flow in B.C. is stated to have taken place on Nov. 1, 1951, when Pacific Fort St. John No. 1 came in.

On March 21, 1952, Fort St. John No. 4 came in with a blow of wet gas in excess of 9 million feet daily, and three weeks later, says this summary, natural gas was found in three formations at well No. 5, a step-out six miles northwest.

Fort St. John No. 3, six and one-half miles northeast of the

original discovery brought in gas in test drilling down to the top-most formation and was then continued downward to tap a daily flow of 2,600,000 cubic feet of gas and naphtha in the second formation and further gas in the fourth formation.

Hole No. 6 struck oil and No. 7, oil and gas flows from two structures. No. 9 also found gas and

oil, a gas flow of 9 million cubic feet daily with oil of 37 degrees gravity.

These seven wells constituted the discovery group, according to the Empire Petroleum report. Among the illustrations is a comparative chart of the oil and gas-bearing formations in British Columbia and central Alberta.

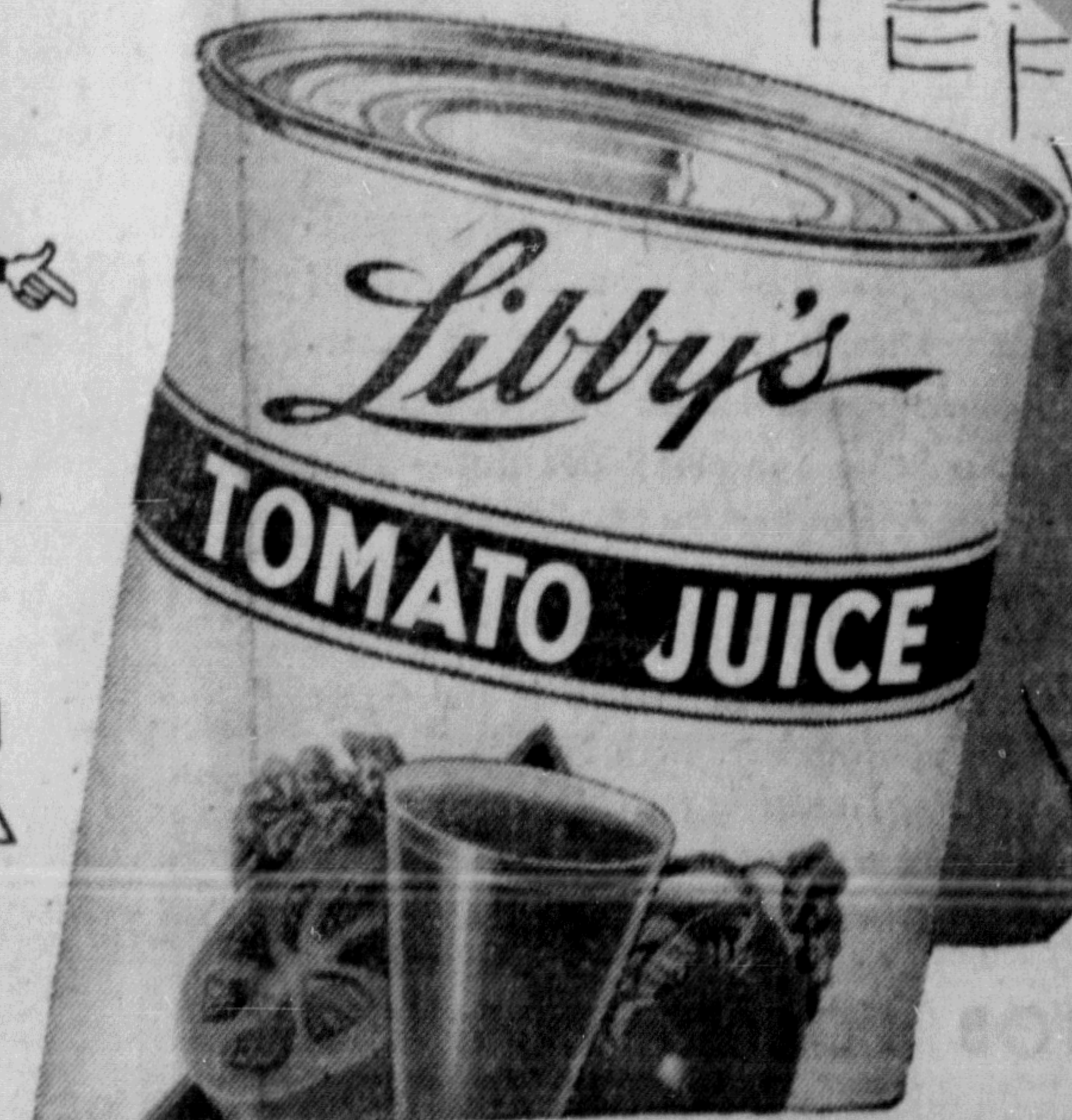

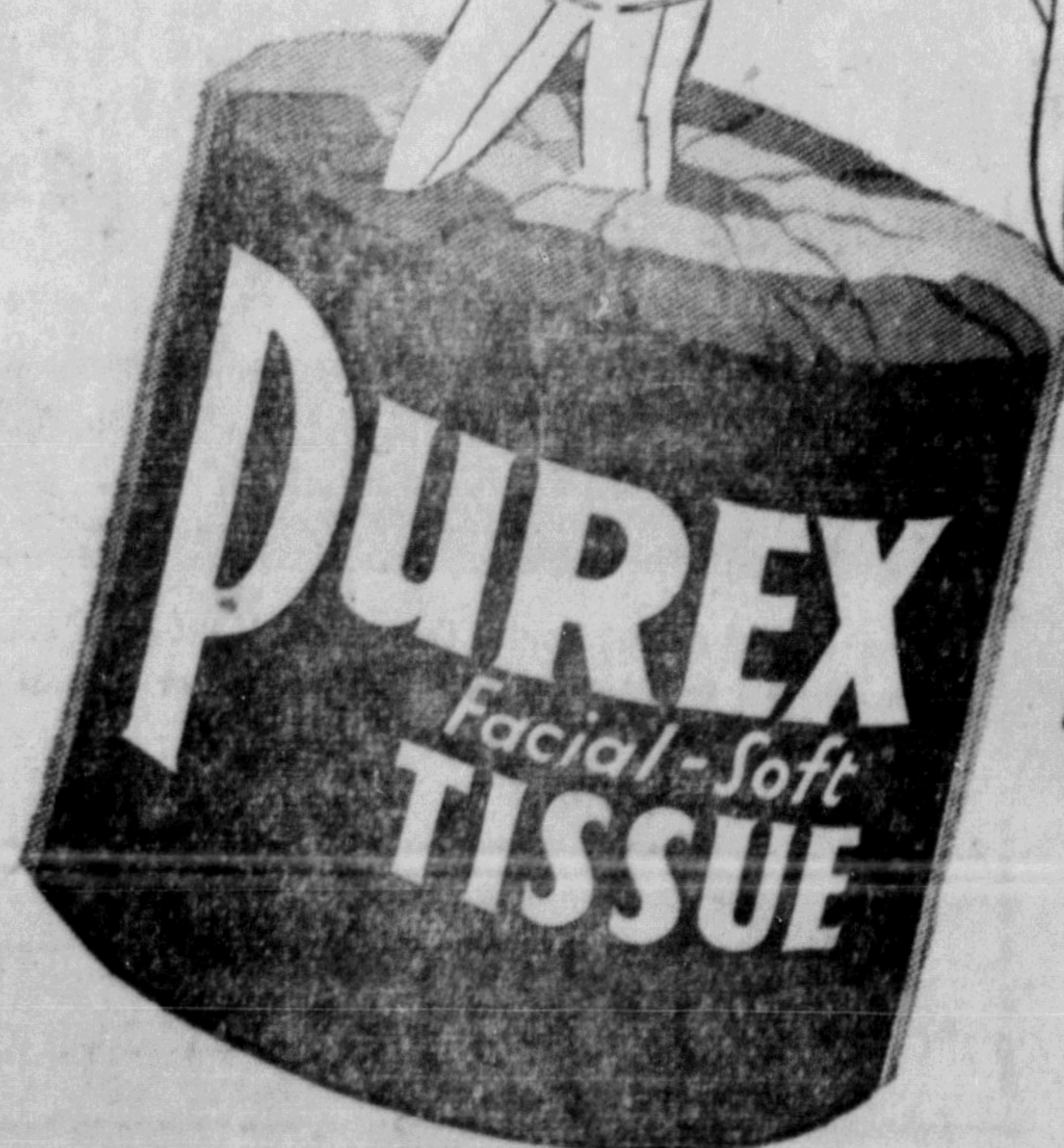
