DISTINCTION BETWEEN USE AND ABUSE DOES NOT EXIST DECLARES SPEAKER

Says Even a Little Alcohol is Injurious to the Person Who Takes it

EDMONTON, March 18. — The trouble with our grandfathers was that they drew a distinction between the abuse and the use of alcohol, said G. R. Jackson, Y. M. C. A. secretary, addressing the congregation of the Grace United Methodist Church on Sunday night on the subject of "Science and Alcohol."

Science had clearly proved that they were wrong in holding this view, continued the speaker, for exhaustive tests had proved that the use and the abuse of alcohol were the same thing. Even the most minute doses taken by a man impaired to some degree the efficiency of his physical and mental powers.

The British government had discovered during the war that the drink evil, considered from its industrial aspect only, was a fertile source of trouble, and experiments carried out on this side showed that one glass of Ontario's 44 beer, lessened the drinker's powers 14 per cent.

This meant, pointed out Mr. Jackson, that every driver of a motor car who took a glass of beer before getting into his car, had lost 14 per cent of his skill and ordinary caution as a driver, and he urged his hearers to consider what the effect of further glasses would be.

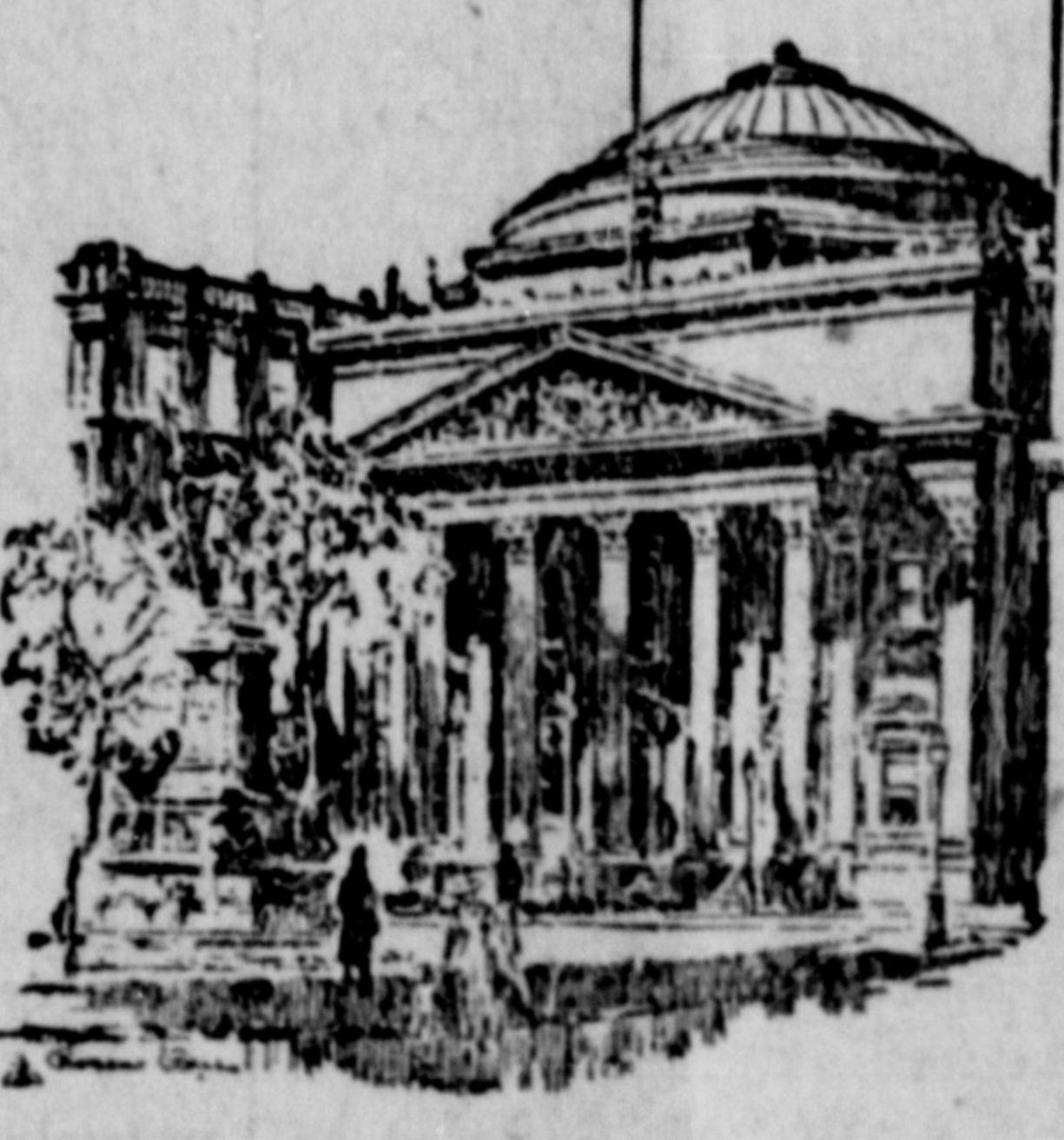

ALDER PRESIDES AT GUILD MEETING IN VICTORIA RECENTLY

Social Activities of Church and Discussed with Former Rupert Man in Chair

W. J. Alder, formerly of Prince Rupert and owner of the Alder Block and property here, presided at a meeting of Christ Church Men's Guild in connection with the Cathedral at Victoria a few days ago. The occasion was to listen to an address to the guild by H. Langley in which the speaker discussed the modern attitude of the church toward life.

Illustrating his point Mr. Langley said:

"As a social reformer, Christ would be interested in the enforcement of the Liquor Act. He would no doubt visit the beer parlors and private saloons. He would most certainly visit our criminal and civil courts; he would, in some disguise, pay visits to Shanghai Alley, to the opium and gambling dens. During the session of the Legislature he would visit the House and listen to some of the speeches. . . . The attitude of the church will determine whether or not the church is to be an important part of the social and spiritual life of the people of tomorrow. The church must adjust its program; it must amend its ritual."

In the discussion which followed, some members of the audience expressed the view that it was not the function of the church to deal directly with social problems. But others who took part in the debate agreed with the speaker's views.
