

PARIS, Oct. 12 .- The Canadian House in the "Cite Universitaire de Paris" will soon open its doors to the studious youth of Canada. The inauguration will take place Saturday, October 30, under the presidency of H.R.H. the Prince of Wales and the President of the French Republic, before a distinguished body of people.

The University City of Paris is the result of a very generous idea. At the end of the war, a great French manufacturer, M. Deutsch de la Meurthe. realizing the difficulties in which the young generation of students found themselves, after the enormous sacrifices which France had made, decided to aid them in a very practical manner. It occurred to Senator Honnorat, minister of Public instruction of the French Government, at the same time, that it would be a great idea to rebuilt around the University of Paris, the Colleges of the Nations which had in times past enjoyed such a great prestige. In accord with Mr. Deutsch de la Meurthe who put at his disposition ten million francs, he decided to found "La Cite Universitaire de Paris" for which he invited the various foreign countries to build Houses where their students would receive, along with very advantageous conditions of living, a first class university education.

The Minister thereupon obtained from the City of Paris, seventy acres of land then taken up by the o'e fortifications in front of Montsouris Park, not far from the Sorbonne and the ing them for their buildings.

SYNOPSIS OF LAND ACT AMENDMENTS

PRE-EMPTIONS

Crown lands may be pre-empted by British subjects over 18 years of age, and by aliens on declaring intention to become British subjects, conditional upon residence, occapation, .nd improvement for agricultural

Full information concerning reguations regarding pre-emptions is given in Bulletin No. 1, Land Series, 'How to Pre-empt Land," copies of which can be obtained free of charge by addressing the Department of Lands, Victoria, B.C., or to any Gov-

Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes, and which is not timberland, i.e., carrying over 8,000 board feet per acre west of the Coast Range and 5,000 feet per acre east of that

Applications for pre-emptions are to be addressed to the Land Commissioner of the Land Recording Division, in which the land applied for is situated, and are made on printed forms, copies of which can be obtained from the Land Commissioner. Pre-emptions must be occupied for five years and improvements made to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivating at least five acres, before a Crown Grant can be received.

PURCHASE

Applications are received for purchase of vacant and unreserved Crown lands, not being timberland, for agricultural purposes; minimum price for first-class (arable) land to \$5 per acre, and second-class (grazing) land \$2.50 per acre. Further information regarding purchase or lease of Crown lands is given in Bulletin No. 10, Land Series, "Purchase and Lease of Crown Lands." Mill, factory, or industrial sites on timber land, not-exceeding 40 acres.

LEASES

Under the Grazing Act the Province is divided into grazing districts and the range administered under a Grazing Commissioner. grazing permits are issued based on numbers ranged, priority being given to established owners. Stock-owners may form associations for range management. Free, or partly free
