### COLOR LINE IN LIFE OF ANTS

STRUGGLE FOR EXISTENCE SEEN IN COLONIES ON PRAIRIES IN EDMONTON DISTRICT

EDMONTON, Oct. 29.—A gruesome tale of home-robbing and kidnapping, and of endless warfare between the Reds and the Blacks in the Edmonton district, was heard at the Philosophical society when the speaker was E. H. Strickland, M.Sc., professor of entomology at the University of Alberta, and his subject, "Insect Social Life."

The Reds and Blacks in question are the red and black ants which are to be seen around the city every summer. The Blacks build the ant hills and live there contentedly each ant busy at its special task, from the queen down to the "soldier," the "worker" or the "nursemaid." Their cousins, the red ants, also live in an organized society, but they lack the ability to build homes for themselves.

Here the trouble begins. A Red queen decides to occupy a new home, so she gets by the "Black Watch" and entrenches herself in the Black stronghold. She kidnaps some of the younger Blacks who bring her supplies, this food sometimes being that of their own brothers and sisters. In time the invader sallies forth, kill the Black queen and then follows a desperate struggle between the Blacks and the young Reds.

The Red ants always being successful. CHANGE MODE OF LIFE  
One hundred million years ago ants were living on the earth in an unsocial mode. Then all traces of them were lost and when found again, 40 million years later, they were living in a highly organized social state. Just what took place in that evolution is open to interesting speculation.

The ants have different ways of gathering food for the winter. In the tropics some are nomads and travel in

armies, killing all animals in the region. The natives of Africa flee before them and any beasts which they trap are soon nothing but dry bones. Some are vegetarians, and the speaker told of seeing them at work in the tropics, stripping shrubs of their leaves and carrying them off to the nest.

The harvester ants gather seeds, which are systematically sorted out by certain insects and stored for future use. A certain species are gardeners and grow a fungus which they eat. These ants cannot live without the fungus, and the fungus, in turn, is dependent upon the ant for its life.

#### ETIQUETTE OF FORMER DAYS

MAN AND WOMAN THEN ATE FROM SAME PLATE AT TABLE

WINNIPEG, Oct. 29.—Antique etiquette and the origin of modern customs and conventions, were related in an address given before the Winnipeg Rotary Club by R. F. Martin, former deputy keeper of the Victoria and Albert museum, London.

According to Mr. Martin, "laying the table" dates back 400 years to the time when tables were merely a number of boards laid down upon trestles. To lay the table meant merely setting these in place.

Those were the days when plates of any kind were unknown, and forks had not been thought of. As a large cut of venison was brought around, each guest hacked off a chunk with his hunting knife and laid it on a thick slice of bread.

Wooden platters came into use during the sixteenth century; pewter plates in the 17th and porcelain and china in the 18th. Forks were introduced in the reign of James I. Previous to that time the ladies and gentlemen used their fingers.

The word cupboard, Mr. Martin explained, comes from the cup board found behind the master's seat, along which he ranged his collection of gold and silver cups and dishes.

Quoting from a code of manners drawn up in the 16th century, Mr. Martin said that the guests were recommended to keep their finger nails clean, to refrain from picking his teeth with his hunting knife or clean them on the table cloth. As the ladies ate from the same platter as their gentlemen companions, they were reminded not take the choicest cut, but to turn it to their lord.

The guests were also asked to breathe through the nose as silently as possible and warned to wipe their mouths before drinking so that no grease would go into the wine, "which is most unpleasant for the next person." Finally the code requests that the guests do not wipe their eyes or face on the table cloth.
