

LIFE OF ANTS

STRUGGLE FOR EXISTENCE SEEN IN COLONIES ON PRAIRIES IN EDMONTON DISTRICT

EDMONTON, Oct. 29 .- A gruesome tale of home-robbing and kidnapping. and of endless warfare between the Reds and the Blacks in the Edmonton district, was heard at the Philosophical society when the speaker was E.
