ROY McKINLEY FOUND GUILTY

CHOSES THREE MONTHS' IMPRISONMENT IN PREFERENCE TO \$300 FINE

Found guilty of selling liquor, Roy McKinley was fined \$300 with the option of three months' imprisonment by Magistrate McClymont in the city police court this morning. With the same air of bravado that featured his conduct in the course of his trial, which was brief, McKinley announced he would do the time and stalked out of the court room with an officer. E. F. Jones prosecuted and McKinley, who had no evidence to offer on his own behalf, was not represented by counsel. McKinley's case was the only one proceeded with today, five other liquor selling cases being adjourned.

WHISKEY AND BEER

The first witness against McKinley was Thomas Sheeves, provincial constable attached to the liquor board. His evidence was to the effect that he, accompanied by Constables George Sheeves and William Gibson and another man, entered a house to the rear of the Royal Hotel and had a round of drinks, three Scotch whiskies and one beer, in payment for which Thomas Sheeves tendered a five dollar bill, receiving three dollars in change. The time was about 6:15 on the evening of Sunday, September 19.

Constables George Sheeves and William Gibson gave corroborative evidence, the latter testifying that another man bought a second round of three beers and a whiskey.

McKinley had no evidence to offer on his own behalf but stated that there was no place known as the Loggers' Club. The place referred to was a private dwelling behind the Royal Hotel.
