NEWEST BOOKS BY CANADIANS

Nellie McClung Has "All We Like Sheep," and Number of Other Writers Busy.

TORONTO, July 21.—New books this autumn will include several by Canadian women writers. "All We Like Sheep," by Nellie McClung; "Blencarrow," by Isabel Ecclestone Mackay; "Blue Castle," a light story for grown-ups, by L. M. Montgomery (who has moved to Norval, Ont., and who is working on another "Emily" book); while a new writer, Constance Travers Sweetman, wife of the well known Winnipeg lawyer, has a "first book" entered, under the title of "Young Folk, Old Folk," a study of the young girl of today and her parents, Mazo de la Roche, who spends her summers always in a retreat in the woods of Clarkson, Ont., is the author of a book, "Delight," which came out a few months ago. In it a young English domestic is pictured, in Canadian days of twenty years ago, frankly in love with life and the homage it pays to beauty, but like a child, and so, often misunderstood, she unconsciously meets and faces dangers, hidden and revealed, in a way that should have been disarming, because of its naive charm.

NEW NOVEL COMING BY BRITISH WRITER

H. G. Wells Writing Three Volume Book Using Living Characters.

LONDON, July 21.—A feature of the new novel by H. G. Wells—"The World of Mr. Clissold," which is to be published by Ernest Benn, Ltd., in the autumn, will be the introduction of a number of living personages under their own names. It will occupy three volumes, which are to appear successively in September, October and November.

The "Observer" on Sunday published a long prefatory note which Mr. Wells has written for the book. Dealing in this with the introduction of characters, the author says: "It is a work of fiction, purely and completely. One thing which is something of an innovation has to be noted. A great number of real people are actually named in this story. It is, the author submits, impossible to get the full effect of contemporary life in which living ideas and movements play a dominant part without doing that. You cannot have a man like Mr. Clissold going about the world of today and never meeting anybody one has never heard of."

ECONOMY IS URGED ON ITALIAN PEOPLE

Avoidance of Feastings, Banquets and Costly Amusements is Urged By Leaders.

ROME, July 20.—The government continues to admonish the Fascisti and the general public to avoid unnecessary expense on feastings, banquets and costly amusements, urging the need of economy in every possible way, to increase home production and cut down imports so as to help stabilize the lira.

A similar note was struck at the opening of the National Institution for Exportation, which Benito Mussolini, the Premier, attended with the finance minister, Count Volpi.

Dr. Pirelli, whom Signor Mussolini charged with the organization of the institution, made a speech on the institution's scope.

EIGHT THOUSAND ARE INDUCED TO EMIGRATE

Various Schemes For Bringing People to This Country Have Considerable Success

LONDON, July 21.—The Dominions' Secretary states that the sailings for Canada under each of the assisted passage schemes during the first five months of this year were as follows:

Government scheme—Nominated persons, 3,327; household workers, 1,094; juveniles of 14 to 17 years, 361.

3,000 Family Settlement Scheme—3,501. Total, 8,283.

Minor Schemes—Society for Overseas Settlement of British women, 58; British Dominions' Emigration Society, 210. Grand total, 8,493.

It is not possible to state the number of applicants who were not accepted, as the greater number of applications are made at the local offices of the Canadian government agents throughout the country, and only those which seem suitable for acceptance are forwarded to the director of migration in London.
