

CBC to Carry Full Report On U.S. Election Tonight

Special arrangements by the CBC have ensured that Canadian listeners will have a poll-by-poll account of the U.S. election returns tonight.

The Trans-Canada network will carry, with slight exceptions, the full program service of the Columbia Broadcasting System after 6:00 p.m. and until such

time as a decision is reached, beyond normal midnight sign-off if necessary. The first three hours of this service will be sponsored by Canadian Westinghouse.

The National News Bulletin will be broadcast between 7:00 and 7:10 and commentaries by Canadian reporters in New York and Washington will be heard during most of the evening five minutes before each half hour, beginning at 6:25. CBC reporters will include Peter Stursberg, L.L. Golden, Walter O'Hearn and Norman Depoe.

CBS commentators taking part will be Edward Murrow, Lowell Thomas, Walter Cronkite, Robert Trout, Dwight Cooke, Charles Collingwood, Eric Sevareid, Douglas Edwards, Don Hollenbeck, Harry Le Sueur and Allen Jackson.

The CBC's Dominion network will carry special election reports and commentaries at 7:30, 8:10, 9:30 and 10:30.

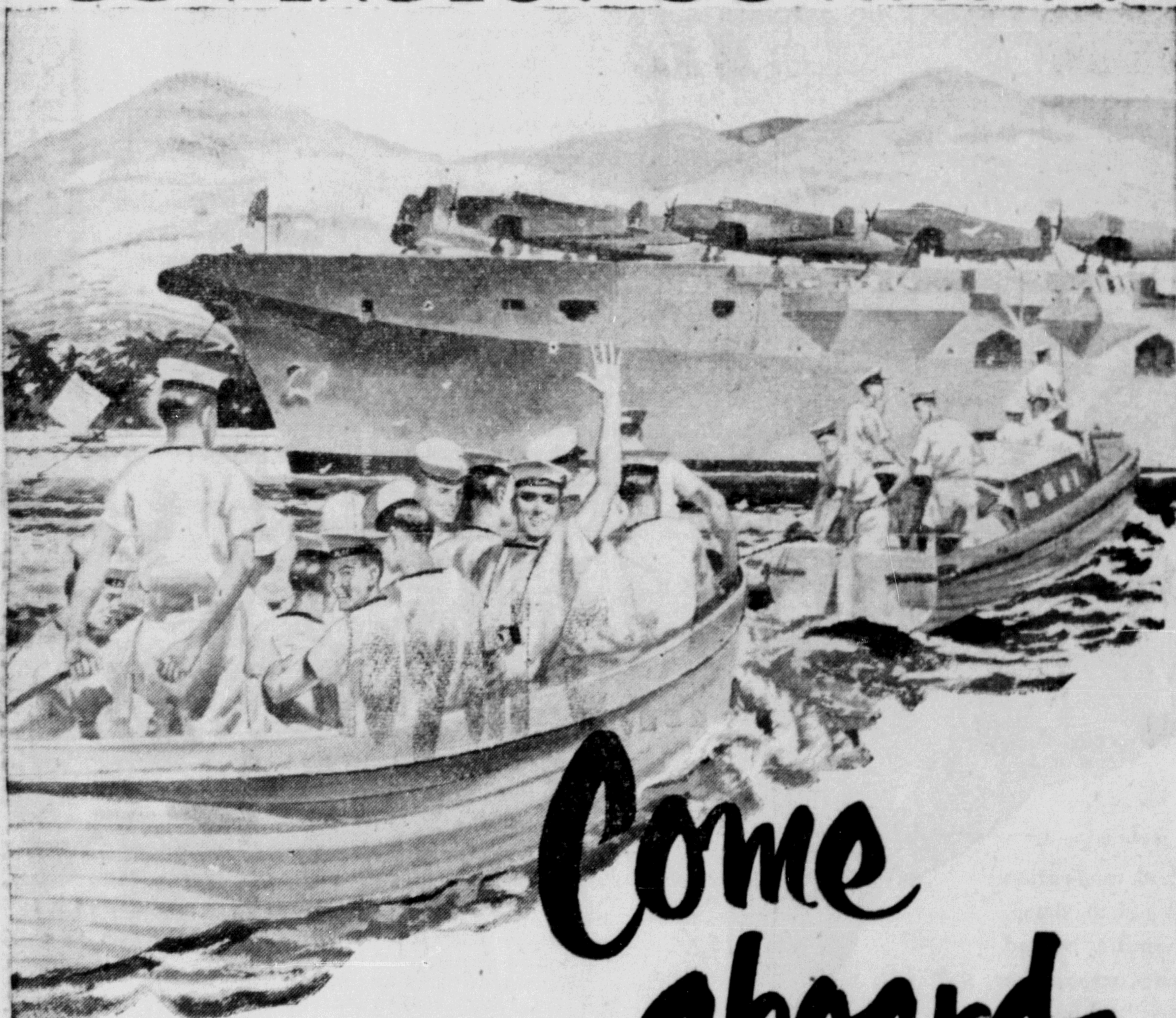

Tennis Courts to Become Ice Rink if Cold Enough

Official Opening Planned

If the weather turns cold enough, the Rotary Club tennis courts on Second Avenue, subject of much controversy during the summer, will be officially opened this winter as a skating rink.

Park Board Commissioners, at a special meeting last night, said they had been assured that flooding of the courts to make a skating rink would not harm the blacktopping.

A letter was read from the secretary of the Rotary Club officially turning over the courts to the Park Board. It was dated Oct. 30.

Commissioners suggested that if the club is agreeable the courts will be named Rotary Tennis Courts and arrangements will be made with Rotarians to take part in the official opening.

At the regular meeting of the Board last week, Commissioner Art Murray was appointed a one-man committee to arrange for flooding of the courts for a skating rink if, or when, the weather turns cold enough. He will also arrange lighting.

Since the courts have not been officially opened for tennis, Commissioners agreed that if it becomes a skating rink first the Rotary Club should be advised and asked to participate in the opening ceremony.

The courts originally were turned over to the Prince Rupert Tennis Club, but it was disclosed that since they were built on city land, operation could not legally be given to a private club.

After a series of meetings, the tennis club decided to withdraw and the Park Board announced it would operate the courts, but due to delays in construction and completion the courts were not opened for play.

SCREEN ★ FLASHES

LONDON—"I am very glad to be able to announce that there will be a full-length feature film of the Coronation in color by Technicolor including the actual ceremony in the Abbey," J. Arthur Rank, head of the British motion picture group bearing his name, announced here today.

"Yesterday's statement by the Earl Marshall permits us now to disclose that arrangements have been made with Technicolor Limited giving us all their available facilities, making possible what I am sure will be an outstanding record of this historic occasion," he said.

The film has been in preparation and partial production for some time past. It will show intimate detail events leading up to the ceremony and will of course be the first film ever made in Technicolor of the act of crowning in the Abbey. It is being produced by Castleton Knight whose earlier pictures include "Theirs is the Glory," the story of Arnhem; and the Technicolor films of "Victory Parade," "The Royal Wedding Presents," "Royal Wedding" and "Fourteenth Olympics."

Special arrangements are being made to release the Coronation film throughout the world in a matter of days after the event. For this purpose hundreds of prints will be required involving an immense production plan in the Technicolor plant and most careful organization.

To meet the world wide interest in the film the most rapid distribution arrangements will be required and will be possible through the expansion of Technicolor facilities in Britain.

"I believe this will be a unique film record of a most memorable event in our countries' history," says Mr. Rank.

TORONTO—For Canada, special arrangements will be made to fly prints of the Coronation film from London with all possible speed in the expectation that they will be presented in the theatres throughout Canada a few days following the ceremony, and probably in one or two situations before the end of Coronation Week, said Leonard W. Brockington, Q.C., president of the J. Arthur Rank Organization of Canada.
