Crown Colony Days

Away back in the late sixties thousands of acres of British Columbia's timber were sold for one cent per acre, which looked like a fair price-then. Today similar timber is worth from \$150 to \$200 per acre, so tremendously has timber appreciated in value within the scope of an average lifetime.

What the young growth of today will be worth sixty years from now is beyond computation if it is protected from fire and allowed to reach maturity.

The moral is obvious.


