# CONSTRUCTION WORK AT FLIN FLON MINE PROCEEDS STEADILY

WINNIPEG, March 14.--Construction work at the Flin Flon Mine, in the Central Manitoba mineral belt, is progressing favorably, officials of the company report. About 100 men are employed in the operations at present and it is expected that the new concentration plant being erected on the property will be operating this month.

The early freeze-up last fall held up transportation of some of the machinery. but the delay has now been made up. The entire plant was conveyed to the ne 160 miles by summer road and 87 miles under winter conditions. A wireless plant has been erected and today the mine is in daily communication with the outside world.




