## Plans Laid For 21st Parliament

OTTAWA - Government officials are completing plans for the seventh session of the 21st parliament.  
The session, possibly the last before a general election, will be opened Nov. 20 by Governor-General Vincent Massey.  
The cabinet has been working for several weeks on a legislative program that is expected to keep the Commons and the Senate busy until late spring. The government hopes to complete the work in time for some members to attend the coronation of Queen Elizabeth June 2.  
Prime Minister St. Laurent hinted several weeks ago there would be no election until after the coronation. However, in the wake of a meeting of the National Liberal Federation last week there has been speculation that the government may decide on a spring election.  
However, most observers still stick to the fall of 1953 as the most likely time for an election. The present parliament ends Aug. 25, 1954.  
Government departments have been asked to have legislation ready for presentation as soon as the session opens.  
The government may propose that the usually lengthy debate on the address in reply to the speech from the throne be shortened or possibly postponed until after legislative measures have been adopted.  
The speech from the throne, read at the opening ceremony by the Governor-General, forecasts much of the government's legislation.  
On some occasions in the past, the debate—it sometimes lasts a month—has been postponed after leaders of all parties have spoken.  
If agreement is reached on a postponement, the government is expected to be ready with other work. The cabinet has been studying legislation for several weeks.  
There have been some reports that Finance Minister Abbott will present his budget earlier than usual, possibly in late February or early March. In recent years he has brought down his budget during the second week of April.

## Hunger, Cold Used Against Mutineers

COLUMBUS, O. (CP) - Twin weapons of hunger and cold were used today against 1,600 convicts in four cell blocks of the strife-torn Ohio state penitentiary, where police have killed one prisoner, and four convicts and one policeman have been wounded.  
Warden Ralph W. Alvis said he had 35 surrender notes from the embattled prisoners, but declared "when we get the right feeling, we'll go in and talk to them."  
He also said some of the more peaceful convicts would be transferred from the prison to other Ohio institutions.

Best Bid Is Not Always Based on Suit Strength

Mr. Dale's spade suit was strictly biddable. But he decided not to respond with one spade. The reason was that he correctly figured his hand was worth only one bid. It was therefore his duty to make that one bid as useful as possible. What could be more interesting and helpful to partner than an immediate raise in a suit in which partner had already shown interest? Nothing. So Mr. Dale bid two hearts.

This is a point that is often missed. If you do respond one spade on Mr. Dale's cards and partner then rebid two hearts, you must pass. Partner is then denied the knowledge that you have ample trump support for his heart suit.

Against the four-heart contract Mrs. Keen made her normal opening of the king of spades. Now, if Mr. Muzzy were playing the hand, he would undoubtedly have taken three rounds of trumps and banked on the clubs breaking 3-3. He would have lost three diamonds and a club.
