

DISTRICT ENGINEER'S SURE WAY CATCH FISH

All That is Needed is Drydock Full of Water and Pumps to Empty it

VICTORIA, March 3 .- John P. Forde, district engineer for the Dominion department of public works, claims to have discovered the surest means of catching fish that has so far been devised. All the equipment that is necessary consists of a drydock full of water and pumps to empty the dock.

Recently the new Songhees drydock at Esquimalt, second largest in the world. was pumped out by the dock master and when the last of the water had been sucked out of the graving basin, a large run of salmen was found on the bottom of the dock, in addition to a number of large codfish and some perch. Every time the dock is emptied some fish are left in the bottom, according to Mr. Forde, although the most recent operation saw the first of the salmon catch.

The salmon caught in the dock averaged from fourteen to fifteen pounds in weight, and as the dock holds 43,000,000 gallons of water some idea of the number of fish which can be caught by this unique method is possible.
