### KISS IS MEANS OF SMUGGLING DOPE

NEW YORK, Dec. 14.—A wife's kiss to her husband is the favorite method of smuggling narcotics into prisons, said Joseph F. Fishman, former inspector of federal prisons, speaking before the World Conference on Narcotic Education. "This is one of many ingenious methods of smuggling drugs to prisoners," he said. "A wife's kiss through the bars does not arouse the suspicions of the prison officials, and she is able to pass from her lips to those of her husband a small packet containing the stuff."
