

TO INDIA WITHOUT STOP

LONDON, April 7.-A British attempt set up a new "record" for a non-stop" flight is to be made by the Royal Air Force some time in May, and a standard day bomber is now being prepared for the task. The object is to fly 4,000 miles with a stop. No official statement has been made upon the subject, nor has the route officially been disclosed, but the present air route of the British Empire is to the East, and all the long non-stop flights have been made in this direction. The last, and so far the "record" non-stop flight was that Lieutenant Costes and Captain Rignot. two French airmen who, last October, flew from Paris to Jask, in Persia, distance of 3,390 miles, in 32 hours. It is obvious, therefore, that to beat that flight a distance of at least 4,000 miles must be aimed at, and in fact, another 600 miles on from Jask would bring an airman to Karachi and India.

It is generally understood that Flight-Lieutenant C. R. Carr. D.F.C., at present on the staff of the Air Defences of Great Britain and stationed at Uxbridge is to be the pilot, while Flight Lieutenant L. E. M. Gillman, also on the same staff for Air Navigation duties, will be the navigator.
