BLACKWOOD on Bridge

One Over-Bid on Four-Card Suit Not Always Practical

Those extremists who believe in a one over one response on any four-card suit, no matter how weak, would have responded one spade on Mr. Dale's hand. Their theory is that partner might have four spades, too, in which case spades would be a good playable trump suit.

But there are disadvantages. In my opinion, when you hold a suit as weak as four to the eight spot, it will not usually turn out to be your best trump suit, unless partner himself can and does bid it. True, when you bid a very weak suit, partner will not give you a double raise without as many as four cards in the suit. But he can properly give you a single raise with only three to the queen or king, in which event you will be sorry you brought up the subject.

And there is also the prospect of partner barging into three no trump, counting on you (reasonably enough) to have at least a stopper in your bid suit. When the opponents rattle off five or six tricks in your suit, partner's reaction will be somewhat grim. Mr. Dale made the sensible response of one no trump in today's deal and a final contract of four hearts was reached.

Many optimistic players would go set at this contract, but it was made to order for Mr. Meek. He expects the worst on every hand and this time he got it. But he was prepared. The queen of diamonds was opened and won by the ace in dummy. The careless play is start trumps at this point and if you do that, you're through.

Not Mr. Meek. He counted on trumps being divided 5-0. At trick two he ruffed a diamond in his hand. He cashed the king and ace of trumps and ruffed another diamond. He then laid down his two remaining high trumps, the ace and king of spades and the ace of clubs for 10 tricks.
